she be well cared for and treated during her natural life should she outlive me and desire to remain there Fourthly: It is also my will and desire that my son James pay to my two grand children George & Lydia Springer one hundred dollars each whenever they come of age, or marry and it is also my will and desire that Lydia have a small table that is at my house at the above named time. It is also my will and desire that my grandson G. B. Lunning have my bed and bedding that I have sleep upon.

Fifthly: I will and bequeath to my son George Lunning the forty five acres of land which I bought of Samuel Springer and lying adjoining to farm which my son George owns upon Wileton River the said forty five acres of land is to be the property of my son George during his natural life and after his death then the property of his lawful children I also will to my son George fifty dollars.

Sixthly: I do hereby nominate and appoint my son James Lunning, Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In testimony whereof I have set my hand and affix my seal this 13th day of May 1872

Will of Daniel Murphy

I Daniel Murphy of the County of Sullivan and State of Tennessee being of sound mind but failing health, and conscious of the uncertainty of life, and of the certainty death, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament

It is my will that my beloved wife Lucy Jane Murphy

shall proper enjoy, and control, all my personal estate, and effects of every kind whatever consisting principally of milk cow, and my household and kitchen furniture.

It is my will that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid, and that any and all debts due me may be collected for this purpose; and for the purpose of comfortably supporting my wife as aforesaid, the principal claim due me is ten dollars due from Mr. W. H. Hopkins, for which I hold his due bill executed on the 11th day of January, 1872

I have a small oats crop growing at W. H. Bakers half of which is mine, this also I wish my wife to have. It is my will that she use and enjoy all my means and effects as aforesaid during her natural life and that she dispose of the same at her death as she may desire or deem best and in order that the purpose of my will may be carried out, I hereby nominate and appoint my beloved wife Lucy Jane Murphy my Executor and desire that she shall not be required to execute any bond for this purpose.
