 Bottom containing twenty five acres more or less
 I give and bequeath unto the children of my daughter Mary
 Burkshart deceased fifteen hundred dollars forty three
 hundred dollars each to be paid them by my Executors
 two years after my decease and no more
 I give and bequeath unto my daughter Margaret Adeline
 Cowan and my four sons William P. Delaney Henry H.
 Delaney Joseph H. Delaney & Frank H. Delaney the
 balance of my estate both real and personal to them
 and their heirs forever after deducting all interest that
 has or may accrue on William P. Delaney's Note until
 two years after my decease

The Last Will of Thomas Odell Dec. ordered by court to be recorded
 County Court Jan'y term 1880

Know all men by these presents that I Thom-
 as Odell of the County of Madison and State of Tennessee being
 feeble in body but of sound mind do make and publish this
 my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all
 other wills by me at any time made.

1st I desire that my funeral expenses and all my just debts
 be paid out of any money of which I may be possessed at the
 time of my death or that may first come into the hands of my
 Executor.

2nd I will and bequeath to my daughter Alice Rutledge wife
 of Samuel Rutledge all of a certain tract of land belonging to
 me in the 4th Civil Dist. and adjoining the lands of the said
 Samuel Rutledge, Joseph Radin and others and containing by
 estimation 76 acres be the same more or less.

3rd I will and bequeath to my daughter in law Mary Odell
 widow of my son William Odell Dec. all of a certain tract of
 land belonging to me in the 1st Civil District adjoining the
 lands of John McGarry, V. Bridleman and others it being
 the land on which the said Mary Odell now lives and con-
 taining by estimation 11 1/2 acres be the same more or less,
 to the said Mary Odell during her natural life and then
 to her children in equal shares to wit William Odell, Mary
 C. Bushong, Isaac Odell Sarah A. Odell and Thomas Odell

4th I will and bequeath to my son David Odell all the
 lands that I have in the 3rd Civil Dist. the same being in
 two tracts or lots but adjoining each other one containing
 by estimation 108 and the other 50 acres including some
 other small surveys and so as to cover all the lands that
 I have in said 3rd Dist. making in all 158 acres be the
 same more or less and adjoining the lands of David Odell on

John Carrer and others.

I desire that John W. Thomas together with some other good man to be selected by my Executors or two in case of an agreement shall act as Commissioners to examine and place a fair valuation on each of the above named and the share or shares that shall exceed in value, the owners of the same shall pay in proportion to such excess in the discharge of my debts or to the other heirs as may be necessary so that they may be equal.

I nominate and appoint my son David Adell my grand son William Adell (son of Mr Adell dead) and Thomas Whittidge my grand son as my Executors.

The Last will

of David & Bucher } Ordered to be recorded County
Court January term 1880

In the name of God Amen. I David & Bucher of said county and county and disposing memory do make and publish this as my last will and testament, hereby revoking and making void any and all others by me at any time made.

First I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any moneys that I may die possessed of, or that may first come into the hands of my Executor.

Second, I give and bequeath to my son George Bucher (or Bucher) the house and one acre of land where he now resides, and no more, to be laid off by a surveyor or immediately adjoining to said house and in as convenient bounds as possible. This I do recognizing my mental Capacity, and legal ability to dispose of my own property as I deem fit, and to remind my said son George of his interferences with my affairs.

Third I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Plevins, wife of William Plevins, to have and hold in her own right and to her sole and separate use as a feme sole the house where the said Mary and her said husband now reside together with five acres, and no more immediately adjoining and attached to said house & to be laid off in the same manner as in the 2^d clause.
