 J. R. Pepper Decd. In the name of God, Amen -
 I, James R. Pepper do
 hereby declare this to be my
 last will and testament
 First. I give and bequeath to my brother George
 R. Pepper my gold watch.

Secondly, I do give, bequeath and devise to Elijah
 H. Surrister all of the residue of my per-
 sonal and real estate to hold in trust for
 the sole and separate use of my daughter
 Ellen Pepper for and during the term of
 her natural life and at her death if it is
 my will and design that the same shall
 go to those of my brothers and sisters who
 may survive her, and I do hereby con-
 stitute and appoint my brother-in-law
 Elijah H. Surrister to be the executor of this
 my last will and testament in witness
 whereof I the said testator, prior to this my
 last will and testament set my hand and
 seal this the 8th day of January, 1860

 testator as J. R. Pepper as his last will and

Also Court held for Washington County the
 23rd day of January 1860.

The last will and
 testament of James R. Pepper deceased,
 was exhibited in Court and proved by
 the oath of John Kuy and John S. Mosby
 two of the subscribing witnesses thereto
 and ordered to be recorded. And on motion
 of Elijah H. Surrister the Executor therein
 named, who took the oath of and executor

prescribed by law and entered into and
 acknowledged his bond in the sum of
 Six Thousand Dollars, with David
 Batyrell and Abner C. Raylor, his sure-
 ties, conditioned as the law directs.
 A certificate, therefore, is granted him
 for the probate of the said will in due
 form
