

Last will & Testament Probated April Term 1891

Harriet Dodge died.

I Harriett Dodge of the County of Sullivan and State of Tennessee being of sound and disposing mind do make and publish this my last will and Testament hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time made.

I direct that my funeral expenses and my just debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any moneys I may die possessed of, or that may first come into the hands of my Executor hereinafter named.

I give and bequeath to my son Asa my tract of land wherein I now live and known as my home place to have and to hold and enjoy the same during his natural life and after his death then to be the property of his lawful children. I also give to my son Asa Dodge all the personal property of every kind that may be in said farm at the time of my death belong to me. And lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my nephew Nelson Gray Executor of this my last will and Testament.

In testimony whereof I have set my hand and affixed my seal this the 29th day of January 1880.
