of land wherein I now live and known as my
home place to have and to hold and enjoy
the same during his natural life and after his
death, then to be the property of his lawful
children. I also give to my son Austin Stodgoe
all the personal property of every kind that may
be in said farm at the time of my death
belong to me. And lastly I do humbly nominate
and appoint my nephew Nelson Gray, Executor
of this my last will and Testament.
