

that this shall be over & above the salary given by the Stock holders. I desire this First Bank of Bristol shall run until the Charter expires, the remainder of income after paying the devise to my wife and Jas. M. Carr to be divided equally with Jno. C. Isaac S. & Margaret, M.

10th I devise that the income of the Store house and lot on 4th Street be used whatever is necessary in repairs & the remainder my Executors shall give to the support of the education of poor children in the Presbyterian Female School, under management of my Executors.

I also devise that the income of the Commission House or Job. Factory be used whatever is needed in repairs & the remainder to be used under the control of my Executors in educating worthy young men for the ministry in King College. Also under their control the interest of 2 thousand dollar bonds 7th of Oct. 1880 & 1881 for the support of the Chair in King College that have charge of this department of education for the ministry, these devises shall continue until my Executors & Board of Curators shall see fit to change the investment.

11th I devise that the lot in front of Pickens Dr. Dietrich's house be reserved as a public square provided the Corporation will use the same, ornament it, keep it inclosed as a public square perpetually, if this is not done it reverts to the heirs.

12 I will & devise that all the real estate willed to my wife, at her decease be divided between my Son John & Isaac except the dwelling house & lots now used that shall be wholly for benefit of Isaac. Any other property not mentioned that I may be possessed of, shall be

divided equally with John C. Isaac, S. and Margaret M. included in this is the old bank corner now used as a store by Hendricks & Pay. Also any personal effects omitted to be divided amongst these three & all my Real Estate devised to these three shall be & is entailed at their decease to their children surviving them.

R." & my silver watch & to William R. one set small silver spoons marked "R. R." 1 silver butter knife & silver soup ladle.

Fourth I give & bequeath the remainder of my estate both real and personal not heretofore mentioned & of which I may die possessed of to my three children equally.

Last I do hereby nominate & appoint Thomas Curtin my Executor & it is my desire & I do hereby nominate & appoint Robert P. Pickle as the guardian of my children.

And it is my desire & I do order & will that my said executor & Guardian be not required to give bond or security in carrying out the provisions of my will. This Nov. 24 1883
