 Samuel Mahaffy died 3 Apr<sup>st</sup> term 1878

In the name of God Amen I Samuel Mahaffy of the County of Sullivan and State of Pennsylvania knowing the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof and being feeble in health but of sound mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking all and making me and void all former wills and gifts by me made.

It is my request that I be decently buried and all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid by my executors hereinafter named of the first money that may come into his hands from my personal estate.

# Sullivan County Recd.

I give to my daughter Mary B. Cahron Seed & her heirs forever the note I hold on their father Robert Cahron deceased executed by my late wife Martha Mahaffy deceased for one hundred and fifty dollars with all interest accruing on the same to them and their heirs forever and no more.

To my daughter Nancy Peters I give and bequeath one Red Cow and her house hold and kitchen furniture and all her wearing apparel & Bridle & saddle and should her present husband John Peters fail to support her then my Grand son David L. Mahaffy is to support her

To my daughter Clarissa Smith deceased to her heirs I will and bequeath jointly one dollar & no more

To my two Grand daughters Frances L. and Martha Allen Morell daughters of Martha Morell deceased I give and bequeath one good young milk Cow to each of them when either marries or becomes of lawful age & no more To my Grand son David L. Mahaffy I give and bequeath one half of my land whereon I now live together with my blacksmith tools my Clock and Porcelain and any Tools and utensils and all surplus stock of Hogs & Sheep to enable him to support his mother her natural life time to him and his heirs of forever & no more

To my two Grand daughters Anna and Melissa Mahaffy I give and bequeath the other half of my land together with all verbal gifts made them by my late wife Martha Mahaffy deceased during her late illness referring to their mother Elizabeth Mahaffy her support off of said land during her natural life time to them and their heirs forever & no more.

To my son Samuel G. Mahaffy I give and bequeath one dollar and no more to him and his heirs forever

And lastly I nominate and appoint John W. Garry Jr. Esq<sup>r</sup> Executor of this my last will and Testament signed sealed and delivered this 25<sup>th</sup> day of September 1857
