1st. I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary A. Carr a full and comfortable dowry out of my real and personal estate as long as she remains my widow -
2d. I bequeath to my beloved three Children Edith Lee, Laura Alletta and David Jobe Carr Jr. all my real and personal estate
3d. I will that my above mentioned Children give my step son Albert F. Dod a comfortable home and a fair education provided he can live with them in perfect harmony in every respect but if he cannot live with my above mentioned Children they are not directed to do any thing for him -
4th. I will that the same as above mentioned in this my last will and testament shall be done for my step daughter Lizzie E. Dod -

5th. I will and desire & direct that if any one or more of my heirs, legatees in this will named shall in any

wise become dissatisfied with the provisions of this my last will and testament and shall bring any suit either in law or equity to alter change or make void any part or provisions therein contained then & in that event I will and direct that my executor shall take the bequest to any such legatee & equally divide it amongst my other heirs here in named and such heirs or heirs legatee or legatees bringing said suit to effect.
