Sullivan County I William S. Smith being of sound mind and sixty six years of age do make this my last will and Testament revoking and by this do revoke all other wills and deeds pertaining to my present property made by me, they having been made in fear of a heavy law suit by a bad man and to prevent the same. I have made it a point to settle up all my business myself before making this my last will and Testament and will proceed as follows.

First.

It is my will and wish that my beloved wife Margaret Smith shall have one third of the amount of all my land including the buildings in which my father lived, also the out buildings, also the new building which I built. The land shall be run so as to give her her portion next to and adjoining the river and shall give her timber sufficient to last her so long as she holds the land. It is my will that she shall have a road through any part of the remainder of my farm, that she may drive the above named property or road to be held by her so long as she remains my widow.

Second.

It is my will and wish that my beloved wife

shall have laid off to her by those men appointed for the same enough of my personal property to meet all her necessities to be held by her so long as she remains my widow.

It is my will and wish that my beloved wife shall have all the ready money that I may have on hand at my death to be used for her personal comfort but not to be loaned.

It is my will and wish that all the above named real and personal property and any of the above money that may be in her possession at the time of her marriage or death shall revert to my heirs.

Third. It is my will and wish that there be one half acre of land laid off around where my deceased wife Polly Smith was buried and that it be reserved for a burying ground.

Fourth. It is my will and wish that the other two thirds of my real estate and what may remain of my personal property after the division be made for my wife, be divided equally among my four daughters, Sarah Ann Arnold, Nancy Jane Childers, Amanda Zimmerman and Mary C. Cole or shall be sold and the money be so divided.

It is my will that the Court appoint a disinterested man to execute this my last will and Testament, he being required to give bond and security for the same. Signed and sealed this the 23rd day of April 1889.
