All my remaining property & effects consisting of other real estate in the State of Virginia or elsewhere together with all my stocks, Bonds Notes &c for the purpose of paying my debts and the support & maintenance of my dear brother Samuel J. James during his natural life and should he die before my dear Father and Mother or either of them then the remainder of my effects then the remainder is to be retained by the said W. M. James or if the survivor of them used it and if not then to be used by them or either of them in the erection of a main central building to be known as the James & Sallins College in Bristol Virginia and said sum so used in said building shall be added to the existing "James Aid Fund" If they desire to do so.

And I the said Charles L. James Do hereby appoint my Father W. M. James & my Mother Mary J. James or either of them with the faithful executing of this my last Will & Testament. No bond is to be required.
