they bought and also I wish my trunk to be given to my daughter
Lucinda. Item 3rd I wish S. W. Witherspoon to go to groceries and
get my money which is coming to me from my son Samuel and after
paying himself for his trouble to keep the remainder and use it for
purchasing necessities for my children as they have need. Item 4th I
desire that my horse and other cow and sheep and all other property
be kept and used by my seven children as necessary. Living along
