Last Will and Testament

Sarah Jane Wilborn decd

Proved July Term 1897.

I, Sarah Jane Wilborn (formerly Sarah Jane Wilbar) of the town of Bristol of the State of Tennessee, being of sound mind & body, but knowing the uncertainty of life do make this my last will & testament discharging the one made in May 1875

I give devise and bequeath my estate and property real and personal as follows that is to say

1st I give and bequeath all of my property consisting of my house & lot in Bristol Tennessee and my cottage & lot in Elk Park North Carolina and my trunks, tools & kitchen furniture to my brother Daniel Frances Wilbar

2nd I give to my brother John F. D. Wilbar the sum of \$200 (two hundred dollars) if he should survive me

3rd I give to my brother Isaac Russell Wilbar the sum of \$200 (two hundred dollars) if he survive me.

4th I give to my nephew Joseph Quincy Wilbar (brother George's son) the sum of \$100 (one hundred dollars) if he survive me.

5th I give to my nephew Joseph Quincy Wilbar (brother Daniel Francis's son) the sum of \$100 (one hundred dollars) if he survive me, not to be paid until after he is 21 years of age

6th I have made the difference in the amounts I have left my brothers, not from any lack of affection for them, but because my father so directed me - saying he had given his other sons more than he had given my son Daniel Francis

7th I appoint my brother Daniel Francis Wilbar of Waynesville North Carolina Executor of this my will, and he shall not be required to give a bond nor security - and further should there not be means enough in my possession at the time of my decease to pay my just debts and funeral expenses he shall sell such of my personal property as may be sufficient for that purpose

8th I further direct that my said Executor shall not be required to pay the full amount of the legacies herein devised, at one time but shall have time to do it in two years if necessary - my brother being paid first the juniors afterwards

9th I also direct my said Executor (in case he does not accomplish it my self before my death to place as my deceased husband George H. Wilborn's grave a tombstone costing not less than \$50 (fifty dollars) in witness whereof I have signed sealed published and declared this instrument as my will at Bristol Tennessee on this the 15th day of March 1893.
