

Last will & Testament

Hannah Shipley decd.

Probated Oct. term 1891

Be it remembered that I Hannah Shipley being weak in body, but of sound mind and disposing memory and considering the uncertainty of this mortal life, do make and publish this my last will and Testament and dispose of my property, both real estate and personal property as follows:

I give and bequeath all my personal property and real estate jointly to my daughter Louisa J. Atkins and my son in law Isaac Atkins, and at the death of either of the above named persons, the property both real estate and personal property to become the property of the survivor, and it shall be the property of said survivor to dispose of as he or she may see fit and proper to do. Said real estate herein mentioned being a tract of land lying and situated on the waters of Fall Creek in the 7th Civil District of Sullivan County, Tenn. containing by estimation, fifteen acres, or the same more or less. I hereby appoint Isaac Atkins sole executor of this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time made.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this 5th day of September 1889.

Wolfe will be satisfied with what I have all ready given him out of my Estate that my son J. C. Wolfe is to have the land all ready deeded to him after paying two notes and interest that I hold against him one note for one hundred dollars \$100.00 to one note for fifty dollars \$50.00 My Daughter A. C. Osborn is to have fifty dollars in cash my Daughter D. A. Portett is to have one hundred dollars & it being already paid to her of which I have her receipt date April 15th 1891 I give my son E. S. Wolfe one boundary of land as follows beginning at a cedar on Joseph Allison's line East through a field and Woodlands to the Glover land to a rock. I give to my two Daughters L. P. Wolfe and C. J. Wolfe the balance of my real Estate by them supporting my wife Priscilla Wolfe during her natural life I also give my wife and my two Daughters L. P. Wolfe C. J. Wolfe and Priscilla Wolfe my wife all of my household and kitchen furniture and I also give two head of horses one two horse wagon and harness for the same and the balance of personal property if any to go into the hands of my executor to be sold and the proceeds to be divided between my lawful heirs and I hereby appoint C. P. Wolfe as executor to execute this my last will and testament and I hereby require C. P. Wolfe to sign after my wife Priscilla Wolfe and my two single Daughters signed sealed is present of us May 21, 1891.
