

Last Will and Testament

Peter Goakley died & Probated June 1897

I Peter Goakley being of sound mind and disposing memory make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills that may have been made by me

It is my will and desire that my funeral expenses and just debts be paid out of the first moneys that may come into the hands of my executor.

First I give and bequeath to my son Dr. D. H. Goakley my silver watch, one bracelet and this brother called him and fifty dollars in money out of my estate.

Sec I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Julia Kate Goller one set of silver tea spoons the ones engraved with the initials of her grand mother one bureau made of Walnut lumber and fifty dollars out of my estate to be delivered and paid to her when she arrives at the age of eighteen years and by my wife with all interest.

Third I give bequeath and devise to my wife the farms on which I now reside being in two tracts the one on which the house stands contains thirty five acres and the other tract contains about fifty acres and adjains the other tract first mentioned, to have and hold as long as she remains my widow and when she chooses to so remain my widow then the land shall be equally divided between Dr. D. H. Goakley & my grand daughter Julia Kate Goller & living. If Julia Kate should not then living then all that about the whole land shall go to and be the property of Dr. D. H. Goakley or his heirs.

I also give to my wife Lizzie Goller all my personal property not otherwise set apart during her widowhood, then to be called at her death and the proceeds to go to my

him as above stated at the termination of such widowhood I charge my wife to act in conjunction with my executor with the erection of an iron fence around my grave large enough to ^{enclose the grave and to} erect a suitable monument over my grave as she may see proper.

Fourth I except and of my bequest to my wife all notes judgments and accounts that may be due and owing to me, and again upon the collection of same as far as in her power to do so upon my death.

Lastly I constitute and appoint W. F. Goakley my executor to this my last will and testament and I hope he will faithfully execute the same and I desire the court to permit him (my exr) to enter upon his duties with out executing bond.
