Hyderpool, a residing and Citizen of Bristol, Sullivan County, State of Tennessee, being of sound mind and disposing memory, Realizing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death, do make and publish this my last will and testament, revoking all others heretofore made, and do will and direct as follows:

It is my will and desire that all my just debts, of every kind and character, including funeral expenses, be first paid, and to that end I hereby authorize and direct my executrix hereinafter named to take immediate possession of my and all of my personal property and out of the first monies or effects coming into her hands she will pay all my debts including funeral expenses.

I will and devise to my beloved wife, Annie Hyderpool, during the period of her natural life time, all, and all the personal property of which I may be seized and possessed, including household and kitchen furniture, lots and accounts, cash on hand and in bank, and which may remain after payment of my debts funeral expenses as provided in first section herewith power to do and manage same.

III

I will and desire to my beloved wife, Annie Hydroport, during the period of her natural life time, and and all the real estate of which I may die seized and possessed, my one half undivided interest in property known as "Ryrie and Collins property" on Fourth Street, Bristol, Tennessee, should I own it at time of my death. I will and desire to my beloved wife, Annie Hydroport, the issues, rents and profits of any and all real estate of which I may die seized and possessed, with power to see and enjoy same as she may see fit and proper, and should it be or become necessary for the support and comfort of my said wife, or for the support, maintenance and education of my two daughters Annie Frances and Mamie Regina, to sell or dispose of any or all of the real estate of which I may die seized and possessed, then and in that event I hereby authorize, empower and direct my said wife to sell or dispose of any or all of my real estate in such way and manner as to her may seem best and proper, and to see and dispose of any or all the proceeds of same for said purpose or purposes should she so desire.

IV

It is my will and desire that my said wife, Annie Hydroport, shall have full power and authority to see and enjoy any and all the personal property of which I may die seized and possessed, to see and dispose of any or all of same should she so desire and use and enjoy the proceeds to see and enjoy the rents and profits of all real estate of which I may die seized and possessed, and to see and dispose of all or any part of the real estate of which I may die seized and possessed, and to see and enjoy the proceeds of same, if necessary, or should she so desire. But should there be any remaining undivided of at the death of my beloved wife, Annie Hydroport, any of my property, either real or personal, then and in that event it is my will and desire, and I so direct, that it be divided equally between my two daughters by my said wife.
