Last Will & Testament

Thomas J. Carr, died

Probated July Term, 1900

In the name of God Amen I Thomas J. Carr of
 the County of Sullivan State of Tennessee being
 of sound mind and memory do make and publish
 this as my last will and testament hereby revoking
 making void all others by me at any time made.
 First I direct that my funeral expenses and
 all of my debts be paid as soon after my death
 as possible out of any moneys that may first
 come into the hands of my Administrator.
 Secondly I give and bequeath unto my beloved
 wife Ellen Carr Control of the whole of my estate
 both real and personal to secure to her a good
 and sufficient support during her natural life
 or widowhood.
 Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my beloved
 son Thomas S. Carr a tract or parcel of my land
 lying in the 15th Civil dist. of Sullivan County
 Tennessee on the west side of the heirs of Shade
 Crawford deceased and Bounded as follows on the
 South by the heirs of N. W. Prather deceased
 and others on the West by Nathan Shipley

and others on the N. A. K. Mullins on the East by the heirs
 of Shade Crawford deceased.

I further will and bequeath unto my beloved son Thomas
 S. Carr a tract or parcel of my land lying in the 16th
 Civil dist. of Sullivan County Tennessee on the North side
 of the beach Creek road, except 34 Acreage Carr Con-
 veyed by me to John W. Ward, and Bounded as follows.

Beginning on a Stake in the line of the heirs of Shade
 Crawford deceased in the center of the beach Creek road
 then a East direction with the center of said road a
 number of poles to a stake in the center of the junction
 of the Harbour and beach Creek road then N. E. direction
 with the center of the Harbour road a number of poles to a
 stake in the center of the junction of the Harbour and
 Coalpit hollow road on the N. E. side of a cleared lot.
 Then N. W. down said Coalpit hollow road with its
 center a number of poles to a stake corner of Eliza
 Mullins, then west or nearly so with said Mullins line
 a number of poles to a beach tree corner to said
 Mullins and the heirs of Shade Crawford deceased then
 South or nearly so a few poles to a stake then ^{west} across
 a small branch a few poles to a stake on the lower
 side of the beach Creek road corner to Crawford heirs
 then South with said line a number of poles to
 a stake in the center of said road the Beginning corner.
 I further will and bequeath unto my beloved son Thomas
 S. Carr Seventeen 17 Acres of my land ^{more or less} lying in the
 15th Civil dist. of Sullivan County Tennessee, and
 Bounded as follows. Beginning on a stake in the
 Coalpit hollow then N. 32 1/2 W. 42 1/2 poles to a stake at
 the mouth of said hollow. Then N. 47 E 43 poles to
 a stake at the mouth of a small hollow then up
 the same S 49 E 22 poles to stake end pointers. Then
 S 75 E 6 poles to a stake at the corner of a field then
 with the center of a fence S 47 1/2 E 78 poles to a white
 oak stump corner to heirs of Hannah Harbour deceased
 then South 22 E 16 poles to a stake in the Coalpit hol-
 low the Beginning corner.

Fourthly I give and bequeath unto my beloved son
 Orville H. Carr Eighty five 85 Acres of my land
 more or less lying in the 16th Civil dist. of Sullivan
 County Tennessee including my homestead where
 I now live and Bounded as follows. Beginning
 at a buckeye near the head of the Spring hollow
 on my old line corner to Wm. K. Carr Conditional
 line then in a westerly direction up to the

top of a ridge to a Chestnut oak corner to David Shipley then with said Shipley line to a white oak my old corner then nearly west a Conditional line to a Poplar on the side of a ridge corner to David Shipley and the heirs of Shade Crawford decess then North with said heirs line, ^{begin} from poles to a stake in the center of the bush Creek road corner to Thomas S. Carr. then East direction with the center of said road and the line of said Carr a number of poles to a stake in the center of the junction of the Harbour and bush Creek road corner to said Thomas S. Carr. then a N.E. direction with the center of the Harbour road and the line of said Carr to a stake in the center of the junction of the Coalpit hollow road and Harbour road at the east end of a cleared lot then down the Coalpit hollow road a N.W. direction a number of poles to a stake corner to Thomas S. Carr. 17 Acres tract known as the Hackman tract then N. 22 E up the side of a ridge 16 poles to a white oak stump corner to the heirs of Hannah Harbour decess then with a Conditional line of the same nearly South a number of poles to a stake on top of ridge where a persimmon once stood corner to Wm. Carr then South west with a Conditional line to a Spring then up the Spring hollow to a buckeye the Beginning corner.

I further will and bequeath unto my beloved son Orville H. Carr four 4 Acres more or less of my land lying on top and South side of Little mountain and Bounded as follows Beginning in the line of the heirs of N.W. Bachman decess on a stake then South E direction down said mountain a number of poles to a stake on top of the high pine ridge in the line of the heirs of N.W. Bachman decess the East with said heirs line several poles to a stake in said line then N 30 W a number of poles to stake then South west about 25 or 30 poles to the Beginning corner Fifth I give and bequeath unto my beloved grand son Osker Whetzel sixty eight 68 Acres of my land more or less lying on top and South side of the little mountain and Bounded as follows Beginning on two Chinguepin oak elm and Spanish oak on top of a spur of said mountain then S 28 E 49 poles to a Spanish oak

and Chinguepin oak elm and Spanish oak on top of a spur of said mountain then S 28 E 49 poles to a Spanish oak and said Chinguepin oak on top of said spur S 60 E 21 poles to a Chinguepin oak N 72 E 62 poles to a Sugar tree at a Spring branch N 28 E 30 poles to two Chinguepin oak on a ridge N 32 W 25 poles to two Chinguepin Oaks N 22 E 27 poles to a large poplar same corner a number of poles to a stake on top of the high pine ridge corner to Orville H. Carr then N.W. up the side of the little mountain with said Carr line a number of poles to a stake in the line of the heirs of N.W. Bachman decess Carr Beginning corner then South 44 West a number of poles to the Beginning corner. In witness whereof, I do to this my Will. Set my hand this the 11th day of July one thousand eight hundred and ninety eight
