life and the certainty of death do hereby and publish
this my last will and testament hereby revoking all
former wills by me at any time made.

1. I commit my body to the dust whomever it comes, directing
that it be decently buried by the side of my wife in the
cemetery at Philadelphia Pa according to the directions
and discretion of my executor hereinafter named.

2. I direct that all my just debts including funeral expen-
ses and expenses of Administration be paid by my executor.

3. I give and bequeath to my son A. S. Gump the sum of
\$1,000.00 to be paid by my executor as soon as the condi-
tion of my estate will permit without unreasonably sac-
rificing my property.

4. I give and bequeath to Annabichok the sum of \$100.00

5. I give devise and bequeath to my daughter Helen Gump,
two thirds of all the remainders of my estate both real
and personal.

6. I give devise and bequeath to my granddaughters Hattie
Sturges Horn Thom, and Leon Sturges, share and share alike,
the other one third of my estate both real and personal,
subject however to a life estate in said one third interest which
I give devise and bequeath to this brother Mena Gump.

7. I authorize and empower my executor or the survivors
of him, it and executors in the settlement of my estate,
he deems it advisable to mortgage or to sell and convey
up and any of my real and personal estate or any
part of same, either for cash or upon credit of public
or private sale, and to execute and deliver all deeds,
instruments of transfer and other writings necessary
to pass a proper title thereto.

8. I hereby nominate and appoint Martin S. Gump,
as sole executor of this my last will and testament,
and having full faith in his integrity request
that he be excused from the execution of bond.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
