First:- It is my will and desire, and I therefore authorize and direct my hereinafter named executor to sell, without unnecessary delay, my real estate situated in the City of Bristol, State of Tennessee, to the best advantage therein at public or private sale.

Second:- I will and direct that out of the proceeds of said sale, the sum of six hundred dollars (\$600.00) be given to my son-in-law, Edward Dieckmann, absolutely, the same to reimburse him for druggists, physicians, and personal bills, and to defray my funeral expenses.

Third:- I give, devise and bequeath, the balance of the proceeds of said sale and in the residue of my estate, whether real, personal, or mixed, and wherever the same may be situated, to my daughter Mary Dieckmann, and the children of my deceased son George Fuhurt, in manner and form as follows:- One half absolutely to the said Mary Dieckmann, and the other half to the children of the said deceased son George Fuhurt, share and share alike.

Fourth:- I hereby nominate and appoint my son-in-law, Edward Dieckmann, the executor of this my last will and testament and it is my wish and desire that no bond of any kind be required or exacted from him as such, and revoking all former wills and codicils heretofore made.

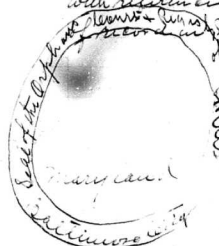
