P. Tolms and on the W. by Mr. Tolms.

At the death of my said wife Elizabeth I will and bequeath all my personal property to my daughter Anna Belle and my farm above described I will and bequeath to my three children equally to be divided between them namely Eliza Castle wife of John Castle, my son Mr. Emory Pile and my youngest child Anna Belle Tolms. My son Frank L. Tolms having been previously provided for I hereby will & bequeath him an amount of one dollar.

I hereby appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth sole Executrix of this my last will without bond.

It is also my desire that my said wife shall be the guardian of my daughter Anna Belle.
