

Last Will and Testament
of

Probated August Term 1903

Be it known that I Virginia Perry widow of Thomas Perry died bring of a Sound mind but considering the uncertainty of life do make and proclaim this my last will and testament. That is to say I give devise and bequeath my estate real and personal as follows:

It is my will and I so direct that all just debts and expenses be paid with convenient speed.

I direct and order that my farm situated on what is known as Roaches branch above Kingsport be sold and the proceeds applied to paying said debts & expenses.

I will, devise and bequeath to J. Madison Oles the farm on which I now live.

In consideration of his faithful labors and untiring attention to me during my life.

I order and direct that said J. M. Oles shall pay to my beloved niece Jennie Boyd wife of Geo. M. Boyd the sum of two hundred dollars.

It is my will that said J. M. Oles pay all just claims against my estate if any after the exhaustion of proceeds from sale of the Roaches branch farm.

It is my will and I so order that if said J. M. Oles should die without heirs that the hundred and two hundred dollars mentioned shall then go to my beloved niece Jennie Boyd before mentioned.

I will and direct that J. M. Oles shall have any money that may be on hand at the time of my death or that may accrue from any sale or sales of any property real or personal at any time thereafter.

I also will and direct that J. M. Oles have one bed and bedding for the same and the balance of my personal property except the remainder of my household goods I will and bequeath to my beloved nephews Will Perry, Hugh Perry, Daor and Thomas Jordan the remainder of my household goods.

I hereby name Geo. H. Gaskley as my executor and declare this to be my last will, revoking all other wills and signs and delivers this on the 4th day of January 1903 in the presence of these witnesses.
