

Last Will and testament. Probated July 1st 1909.
John W. Sells, deceased.

I, John W. Sells, of the County of Sullivan and State of Tennessee, being of sound mind and disposing mind and memory, do make and publish this, as my last will and testament, hereby revoking and making void all others by me at any time made. First, I direct that my funeral expenses and all my just debts be paid as soon after my death as possible, out of any money that I may die possessed of, or what may first come into the hands of my executors.

Secondly, after my funeral expenses, debts, and costs of administration shall have been paid, I direct that all the remains of my personal property shall be divided among my children in the following manner to wit; one half of same equally among my three sons, John W. B. Sells, West Sells and Jack B. Sells, and one half equally among my four daughters, Frances E. Sells, Cynthia M. Jenkins, Emerald C. Perrott and Sarah C. Rhea. Should any one of my said children, except said Sarah C. Rhea, die before I do, I direct that the share of the one so dying in my personal property be equally divided among his or her next of kin; but if said Sarah C. Rhea should die before I do, I direct that her share in my personal property be equally divided among her surviving brothers and sisters or their legal representatives.

Thirdly, I give and devise to my son, John B. Sells, a tract or parcel of land, containing 128 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres, more or less, situated and lying in the 16 Civil District of Sullivan County, and bounded as follows: Beginning at a planted rock, a compromise corner established by Sells and Shetton, thence running with a compromise line as agreed on by Sells and Shetton, North 42 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° West 128 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles to a chestnut near the top of a hill, an old corner, thence with Shetton's line North 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° West 34 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles to a forked white oak, and with Shetton's line North 50 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° West 24 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles to a planted rock at a fence post corner to McClellan, and with his line South 48 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° West 47 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles to a planted rock.

corner to McClellan and Miller, and with Miller's line South 57° West 18 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles to a planted rock on or near said line and on the line of the U. and S. W. Railway 30 feet from center of track, and with the line of said Railway South 43° East 13 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles, thence South 37° East 22 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles, thence South 25 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° East 113 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles, thence South 16 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° East 20 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles, thence South 64 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° East 8 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles, thence South 4° West 23 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles to a planted rock at the road and near where the wagon road passes under the Rail road, thence crossing the Railroad North 74 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° East 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles to a gate post, corner to Fanny Sells, and with her line South 62 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° West 19 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles to a planted rock at a gate post, thence South 38° West 22 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles to a planted rock, thence South 68 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° West 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles to an elm near the spring, the, i.e. South 13° 38' East 12 poles to a planted rock, thence South 52 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° West 7 poles, thence South 87 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° West 18 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles, thence South 41 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° West 18 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles to a planted rock at the branch, Fanny Sells corner, thence South 56° East 17 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles crossing the U. and S. W. Railway to a planted rock, thence South 40° 55' East 120 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles to a Stake in the wagon road on line of the Southern Railway Co., 30 feet from center of the track and bearing South 40° 55' East 10 $\frac{1}{4}$ lines from a planted rock, thence North 44 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° East 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles, thence North 30 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° East 14 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles to a planted rock, thence North 30° East 26 poles to a planted rock, thence North 30 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° East 34 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles to a planted rock at a gate in a road, thence running with the center of the road until it meanders North 34 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° West 24 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles, thence North 30° West 14 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles, thence North 44° West 9 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles, thence North 31° West 21 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles, thence North 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° West 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles, thence North 34° West 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles, thence North 38° West 28 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles, thence North 26 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° West 17 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles, to a planted rock, thence North 149 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° East 47 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles to a black oak, thence North 21° 54' West 9 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles to a planted rock, thence North 27° East 38 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles to the beginning.

Fourthly, I give and devise to my son John B. Sells, a tract or parcel of land, containing 83 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres, more or less, situated and lying in the 16 Civil District of Sullivan County, and bounded as follows: Beginning at a planted rock in the road at a gate near the Southern Railway,

thence with the center of a wagon road as it meanders North $5\frac{1}{2}$ ° west $24\frac{1}{2}$ ° poles, thence North 30° west $14\frac{1}{2}$ ° poles, thence North 44° west $9\frac{1}{2}$ ° poles, thence North $31\frac{1}{2}$ ° west $21\frac{3}{4}$ ° poles, thence North $8\frac{1}{2}$ ° west $8\frac{1}{2}$ ° poles, thence North 34° west $6\frac{1}{2}$ ° poles, thence North 38° west $28\frac{1}{2}$ ° poles, thence North $36\frac{1}{2}$ ° west $17\frac{1}{2}$ ° poles to a planted rock, thence with $49\frac{1}{2}$ ° East $117\frac{1}{2}$ ° poles to a black oak, thence with $21^{\circ} 54'$ west $8\frac{1}{2}$ ° poles to a planted rock, thence North $5\frac{1}{2}$ ° East $38\frac{1}{2}$ ° poles to a planted rock, a compromise corner between Sells and Shatto, thence with Shatto's line North 50° East 71 poles to a Stake, thence South $5\frac{1}{2}$ ° East 2 poles to a planted rock on the crossing of the Rail Road, thence with the line of the Rail Road South 80° East 20 poles, thence Shatto 12° East 44 ° poles, thence South 40° west 23 poles to J. W. and J. River's corner, and with her line and the Rail Road South 20° west $10\frac{1}{2}$ ° poles to Mrs. Flemons corner, thence with her line South 20° west 27 poles to a Stake near a gate, thence thence South $30\frac{1}{2}$ ° west $81\frac{1}{2}$ ° poles to the beginning.

Firstly, I give and devise to my daughter Esmeralda C. Parrott, wife of J. L. Parrott, for and during the term of her natural life a tract or parcel of land, containing $5\frac{1}{4}$ acres, more or less, situated and lying in the 16 Civil district of Sullivan County, and bounded as follows: Beginning at a planted rock on the line of the U. and S. Ry. Railway and a line of the tract of land herein devised to John B. Sells, and with a line of the same and a line of a tract of land conveyed by me to Frances E. Sells, North $56^{\circ} 22'$ west $27\frac{1}{2}$ ° feet to a planted rock, corner to Nelson and King, and with King's line South $7^{\circ} 45'$ west $47\frac{1}{2}$ feet to a Stake, corner to King, and with King's line South $8^{\circ} 31'$ East $117\frac{1}{2}$ feet to a planted rock bearing South 71° East 3 feet and 9 inches from a double cedar post, and with King's line South $8^{\circ} 15'$ East $66\frac{1}{2}$ feet to a planted rock where a white oak stood, thence with King's line South $44^{\circ} 30'$ west $27\frac{1}{2}$ feet to a Stake, and with King's line South $68^{\circ} 50'$ west 70 feet to a Stake, then South $56^{\circ} 40'$ west 250 feet to a Stake, thence South $82^{\circ} 25'$ west 50 feet to a post, corner of tangent lot,

thence South $56^{\circ} 15'$ west $32\frac{1}{2}$ feet to corner post of said lot, thence South $26^{\circ} 35'$ west 102 feet to a Stake on the bank of the branch, thence South 32° East 70 feet, horizontal measure, crossing the branch to an elm at the corner of a wire fence; thence North $54^{\circ} 30'$ East 240 feet to a Stake on a line of the U. and S. Ry. Railway 30 feet from center of track, thence with the line of said Railway as it meanders to the beginning.

I give and devise the remainder interest in said tract of land, after the termination of the life estate herein devised to said Esmeralda C. Parrott, to the children, and legal representatives of deceased children, of the said Esmeralda C. Parrott.

The life estate in said land devised to said Esmeralda C. Parrott, and the rents and profits thereof are to be free from any debts and liabilities of the husband of said Esmeralda C. Parrott.

Secondly, I give and devise to my son, James B. Sells, two tracts or parcels of land, situated and lying in the 14 Civil district of Sullivan County, and being portions of the land of R. B. Rhea a farm, and bounded as follows: 1st tract, bounded on the east, by the lands of J. B. McCallum (now owned by Mahaffey Bros); on the south, by the lands of W. H. Huntington and one Greenway; on the west, by the lands of M. L. Thomas (now owned by H. King); and on the north, by the homestead and dinner land off and set apart to Sarah E. Rhea, or by the public road leading from Thomas' mill to Butteger Mar Lances Farm, and containing $9\frac{1}{2}$ acres, more or less, and being the land conveyed to me by N. J. Principi C. & M., by deed dated 10 April, 1895; and recorded in the Register's office, at Blountville in Deed Book, Vol 64, pp. 29-31, to which reference is hereby made for a full description of said land, 2nd tract, bounded on the north, by the lands of the heirs of Edmund Smith, dec'd; on the east, by the homestead and dinner of Sarah E. Rhea; on the south, by the said $9\frac{1}{2}$ acres, by the public road leading from Thomas' mill to Butteger Mar Lances Farm; and on the west, by the lands of H. B. King, and containing 22 acres, more or less, and being that part of the lands of R. B. Rhea, dec'd, sold in the county court of Sullivan County, in the cause of James W. Sells, ad. vs. Mrs. Margaret Rhea, et al., and

bid in by Sarah E. Rhea, and afterward sold in some cause for unpaid purchase money, and bid in by me.

Seventhly, I will and direct that my son John B. Sells, pay to my daughter, Cynthia Ann Jenkins, wife of P. B. Jenkins, the sum of four hundred (\$400⁰⁰) dollars; said sum to be paid in two installments, of \$200.⁰⁰ each, in one and two years after my death, and to constitute a trust upon the tract of land hereinbefore devised to him, the said John B. Sells, until fully paid.

Eighthly, I will and direct that my son, James B. Sells, pay to my daughter Sarah E. Rhea, provided she desires me, the sum of three hundred (\$300⁰⁰) dollars; said sum to be paid in two equal installments, in one and two years after my death. If said Sarah E. Rhea should die before I do, then said sum of \$300⁰⁰ is to be paid, at the times stated, to my remaining six children, or their legal representatives, share and share alike, the legal representatives of any that may die before I do taking the share of their deceased parent. Said \$300⁰⁰ is to constitute a trust on the lands devised to said James B. Sells until fully paid.

Ninthly, No provision is herein made for my daughter Frances A. Sells, except insofar as is hereinbefore provided, for the reason that I have hitherto conveined to her the interest I intended her to have in my estate, real and personal.

Tenthly, It is my will, and I so direct, that the road running easterly and through the tracts of land devised to John B. Sells, James B. Sells and Fernaralda C. Parrott, beginning at the trustee on the U. T. & S. W. Railway and intersecting the public road near the old Jenkins Tanyard, shall remain and be kept permanently open, for the convenience of said devisees.

Eleventhly, Should any of the parties to whom I have made bequests of personal property or devises of real estate seek to contest my will or make any attempt to break same, or distract my executors, by suit or otherwise, in the lawful execution of their trust, such party shall thereby forfeit any and all claims to the bequest or devise herein made to such one,

and to any interest in my estate, real or personal, and that part of my estate herein bequeathed or devised to such one shall be equally divided among his or her brothers and sisters, or their legal representatives.

Twelfthly, I hereby nominate and appoint John B. Sells and Mr. G. Sells executors of this my last will and testament, and direct that they shall not be required to execute bond as such executors. All erasures and interlineations in the foregoing will were made before same was signed.
