I Thomas Skinner do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills by me made at any time

1st I will and direct that my living expenses and all my debts be paid out of any money that I may have at my death or may come into the hands of my executor and I will and bequeath to my wife Lavina Skinner my Land the home where we now live and she can sell said land if she chooses but not to take less than twenty five dollars an acre under no circumstances

2nd I will and bequeath to my wife Lavina Skinner all my Personal property of all description consisting Horses Cattle Hogs Hides sold and a kitchen furniture grain and hay and she can sell the same if she chooses to live on or do as she pleases the same lastly I nominate and appoint G. E. Keas, Jr. as my Executor with out Bond to wind up my Estate in witness whereof I do to this my last will set my hand and seal this the 8th day of Oct 1903
