In the name of God Amen.

I, Rebecca Hearley being of sound and disposing mind but mindful of the uncertainty of life, do hereby make, publish and declare this as my last will & Testament hereby revoking all wills heretofore made.

1st - I do hereby bequeath & devise all of my property both real, personal and mixed wherever situated to be collected and sold & the proceeds arising therefrom to be divided equally after the payment of any just debts and expenses among my children to wit: W. F. Hearley, Lina, Sambright, George, Rebecca, Jennie, K. Caldwell, Elizabeth K. Hysong, Meta B. Seldock, Agnes Cooke, Rebecca Reiser, Charles B. Hearley.

2nd, I hereby constitute & appoint my son in law W. F. Cooke, as executor of this my last will and Testament & hereby request that he be permitted to qualify as such executor without bond or security, & I do hereby authorize and empower him in his discretion & according to his judgment to collect and take charge of all my property of every kind & to collect, sell, assign & dispose of the same as best he can, and out of the proceeds to pay all the expenses incurred and all of my just debts & to distribute the balance of said proceeds as directed in the first clause equally among my children.
