

Last Will and Testament of
Andrew Troxell died

Probated Sept Term 1898

I Andrew Troxell do make and publish this as my last will and testament hereby not being and releasing void all other wills by me at any time made.

1st I will that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any money or any property that I may have at my death.

2nd I give and bequeath to my son-in-law Wm Bodger and my daughter Nancy on Bodgers wife of Wm Bodger the part of my farm on which the dwelling house is and commencing on a marked nail on the South side of the road leading from Blountville to Kingsport then a straight line passing the corner west of Wm Bodgers corner to a point on S. C. Ladner line all the land in side of boundary including children.

3rd I give and bequeath to my son Wm Troxell the remainder of my land (see the upper part of the same commencing on a marked nail corner to lot no 1st running with said line to a point with said line of the first part on S. C. Ladner line all on that side of that line and and Wm Bodger and wife & Wm Bodger is to make the said Wm Troxell a deed to one and half acres of land that they have in the boundary.

4th I direct that all my wheat and corn and potatoes be sold at my death and all the money held and retained furniture and put to my funeral expenses and any money that I may have at my death if any thing over it is to divide between Wm Troxell & Wm Bodger.

5th I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Smith the one half of the amount of money that I spent on my late funeral in funeral expenses I do to this my will set my hand and seal this the 19th day July 1898
