This property not to be sold or exchanged during the life term of the said Helina C. Heaver without the consent of J. M. Robinson, or her surviving brother, W. A. Robinson or sister, Alice D. Heaver.

I further will that in the final distribution and settlement of my estate among my heirs, that they shall each be charged as an advance payment, without interest, the following amounts, viz: Alice D. Heaver, \$100.00, Helina C. Heaver, \$50.00, W. A. Robinson, \$50.00, J. M. Robinson, \$50.00.
