In the Name of God Amen I, M. B. Wood, a citizen of the City of Bristol, Virginia, hereby make my last will and Testament in manner and form as follows to wit:

First: I will and bequeath my soul to Almighty God, who gave it, trusting alone in the mercy of my Savior, Jesus Christ.

Second: I will and bequeath all the money, credits and property, both real and personal, with which God has blessed me with, as follows, to wit:

Third: After the payment of all my just debts and funeral expenses, I desire that my Bank Book on the Bank of Bristol in said City, be divided into four parts of Five Hundred and Fifty (\$550.00) dollars each. And that the first part of \$250.00 be given to my beloved wife, and that the second part of \$250.00 be given to my son, Henry C. Wood, and the third part of \$250.00 be given to my daughter, Jennie Wood Caldwell, and that the fourth part and remainder thereof be given to my daughter, Anna Wood Himesy.

Fourth: I will and bequeath my money and United States Bonds, now deposited in the First National Bank of Bristol, to be divided as follows:

To my said wife, \$2000.00; to my son, Henry C. Wood, Jr. \$2000.00; to my daughter, Jennie Wood Caldwell, \$2000.00; and to my daughter, Anna Wood Himesy, \$2000.00; If at the time of my decease, there is not money enough in said bank to pay these above bequests in full, then they shall be paid pro rata to each of said heirs.

Fifth: I will my Livery house and Lot, situated at the corner of State and 5th Streets, in Bristol, Tennessee, to my said wife, and three children herein named, it being entirely free from all encumbrance, I having paid everything due to my wife. The rent and proceeds of said property, I direct and request to be divided into four equal parts and paid to my wife, and three children above herein named, and when the lease of Cross and Company expires, I give all of said last mentioned Livery house, including the smaller room, now rented to J. H. Lewis, Paper Hanger, to my said wife and to my said three children, and heirs above herein named, to be divided into four

equal parts in which they shall become joint owners.
Sixth: To my said wife and her heirs, to my beloved wife
 my piano and Angelus, my Cherry bedstead, bureau,
 washstand, my dining table, China closet, dining chairs,
 Chiffonier and my stove and all my kitchen furniture.
Seventh: To my son Henry, I will my new Mahogany
 bedstead, bureau and washstand, my invalid chair
 and office chair, the table now in my family
 room, my oak book case and one half of all my
 books, two leather chairs, one leather couch and
 my grand father clock now in the hall.

Eighth: To my said daughter, Jennie Wood (colored),
 I will my Mahogany table now upstairs and my
 large oil painting of my wife, (her mother).

Ninth: To my said daughter, Anna Wood (colored)
 I will my diamond brooch, one Persian rug
 now in the hall and one half of all my books.

Tenth: I hereby assign to my blood wife, Mary
 W. Wood, my Executor, and my son, Daniel C. Wood, my
 Executor, my Executor, to act jointly to carry
 out this my last will and testament, and I
 request that no bond or security be given to
 them or supplied by the Court, and that no
 inventory be required of them, and that no
 public sale be had, and that this my will, be
 approved in the Corporation Court of Bristol,
 Virginia, and that it be certified copy thereof be
 recorded in the Clerk's Office of County Court of
 Sullivan County, Tennessee.

I request that, if any legal question arise,
 pertaining to the execution of this, my will, that my
 Executor my Executor consent to be paid by the Court.

Eleventh: I desire and request that my residence
 and the on Solar debt, and the two lots and the
 building thereon on Oak Street, shall be equally
 divided between my said wife and my two children,
 hereafter named, and that my said wife and
 my said son, Henry, shall continue to live in my
 said dwelling house so long as my said wife
 shall remain single, and in the event of either
 her death or marriage, my said dwelling house and
 lot on Solar and Dyarhorn Streets, shall revert,
 and descend to my said son, Henry, and my said
 daughter, Jennie, and my two lots, situated on Oak
 Street, shall be sold to the best advantage and the
 proceeds of such sale shall be equally divided.

 dren, hereafter named.

Twelfth: I will and bequeath to my said daughter,
 Mary, the lot of land on Belmont Street,
 which I purchased of John Rader.

Thirteenth: I will to my son, Daniel C. Wood, the sum of \$500.00 to be used exclusively
 for his education. I will to Jennie Smith (colored)
 who lived with me and cooked for my family
 at State City for twelve or thirteen years, the
 sum of \$200.00; to Mary Warr, (colored) who lived
 with me and cooked for my family for several
 years after I moved to Bristol, I will
 the sum of \$250.00; to Lige Tindleton (colored)
 who is now living with me and cooking for
 my family, I will the sum of \$100.00. Each of
 the said four sums are to be paid by my
 Executor and Executors, hereinafter named.

Fourteenth: All my personal furniture, in-
 cluding silverware, China and glassware,
 not mentioned or specified above herein
 I will to my wife during her natural
 life or widowhood and my household fur-
 niture, including silverware, China and
 glassware, not mentioned or specified above
 herein, and at the death or marriage, be
 divided as my wife thinks proper. All my
 real accounts, debts and debts of every
 description shall be divided between my
 said wife.

Fifteenth: If I am hereafter, or any one of
 my heirs, shall execute this will to make or
 impair any of the provisions of this will, he
 or she shall not inherit or come into possession
 of anything devised or given to him or her
 by this will, and such part or parts shall be
 equally divided among such heirs as are
 willing to settle up this will. I have read
 to the said and substantial and I certify
 that all my rights and debts be respected
 and added to.
