State of Tennessee and having the right
to dispose of the same as seems
best to me do hereby will and bequeath
for love and affection that my daughter
Emily Jewell at my death shall have
ten acres of said tract of land to
remain to her and her lawful heirs
Also my daughter Susan shall have
ten acres of said tract of land at my
death to her only proper use,
Also that my daughter Nancy shall have
ten acres of said tract of land to her
only proper use. Also my daughter
Lucinda Jane shall have ten acres

include the turkey pen hallows and all
the remaining heirs named in the will
may divide as they wish provided
each shall have their ten full ten acres

mentioned. Now it is my will
and desire that each heir have a
place to sit a house - as convenient
to water as possible which
amount shall be extra and in addition
to the aforementioned sum. And I further
will and require that if my daughter
Margaret cannot induce each heir herein
named to pay their proportional part
of the taxes on said lands which I
desire them to do then she is fully
empowered www.southeasterngenealogy.com each land of
delinquency on fall if she so desire, and
apply the proceeds of such sale first
to the satisfaction of the taxes and
divide the remainder if any thereof equally
among all the heirs herein named.
It is further my desire that this will
be executed in as full and ample
manner as to give each heir as much
timber as possible.
