the homestead on which I now live or all the land on the South
or South and West Side of the Creek over which she is to have full
control during her life

3rdly

It is my will and desire that any and all of my personal property not dis-
posed of above be sold at public sale and the proceeds thereof together
with all promissory notes due bills and acc'ts of every description be equally divided
between the Heirs of my body

4thly

for and during her natural life. I also will and bequeath to her
The homestead on which I now live. or all the land on the South
or South and West side of the Creek over which she is to have full
Control during her life

It is my will and desire that any and all of my personal property ~~not dis-~~
posed of above be sold at public sale and the proceeds thereof together
with all preliminary costs due bills and debts of every description be equally divided
between the heirs of my body
