Be it remembered that at a County Court begun and held at the Court house in the town of Maynardville on the first Monday of February 1872, it being the 5th day of the month present and presiding were the Worshipful J. Hill Chairman &c and with him G. W. Evans and H. A. Sharpe Justice of the peace for said County, where the following proceedings were had to wit.

By leave of the Court J. H. Butcher, and John Cox, came into open Court and taken upon himself the Administration of the estate of John Sharpe, deceased and entered into Bonds with Security, according to law and was then qualified which Bonds in words and figures following to wit.

Know all men by these presents, that we John Cox, J. H. Butcher, A. A. Snoderly, and A. J. Savage, are bound to the State of Tennessee, in the penalty of two thousand dollars, which Witness our hands, this 5th day of February 1872.

The Condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above bound John Cox, & J. H. Butcher, has been appointed administrators of John Sharpe, deceased, now if the said John Cox, & J. H. Butcher, shall well and truly, as such administrators perform all the duties which are, or may be required of them by law, then this obligation shall be void, other wise to remain in full force and virtue.

Letters of Administration
