The last will and Testament of Sam. Smith
of White County was that of Tennessee
I Sam. Smith considering the uncertainty
of this mortal life and being of sound mind
and memory I have by and for the above do
make and publish this my last will and
Testament by words and term following
(That is to say.)

First I give my soul to the good voice given
to me and my body to the matter earth with all
the furniture as well as the furniture of the
land I give and bequeath all my lands both
Indian and school lands that I have to my
will beloved wife Nancy Smith the life time
together with all water buildings and improvements
thereunto belonging and all my personal
life also all my household and kitchen
furniture and also all my farming
utensils of every description and all stock
of horses and oxen and all other stock
that I have consisting of cattle and hogs
All and each of my and all other grain
and one wagon and also my cotton gin
and my house and garden some and
and that I wish her to have the entire
possession of said property while she may
live and that I also will to my wife Nancy
my Negro woman Clarissa together with
all her increase during life also my negro
woman Olive I wish also will to her son
Sam. Wm. Sam. Smith's son Frank proper
Lydia and nursing nurse and her children
and also I will all my best debts to be
paid out of my estate first and all
debts due me I will my wife Nancy

To have the entire bought some again at
the death of my wife Nancy Smith I will that
all of said real & personal property as so much
which as may then remaining to be Equally divided
between my two children (to wit) Joel
Mittelman, William and Hannah

And further I wish my wife Nancy Smith
to give my said two children as liberal
education as she can conveniently do

I again will that my son John A.
Smith have fifty cents out of estate to be
paid him by my executors And I also
will my two daughters have fifty cents
each (that is) Mary Vincent wife
of Isaac Vincent have fifty cents and
Mary Smith wife of John Smith have
fifty cents. Sarahetta Muttman wife of
James Muttman have fifty cents and
Anne Mitchell wife of Allen Mitchell
have fifty cents to be paid them out of
the estate by my executors

Having herefore in my time given
my said two daughters as much of
my real and personal estate as my
circumstances would admit & In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
Seal this 13th day of December 1852
