 and Some she brought with her own money and
 fine bed blanket she brought with her money
 My will is that my three sons to wit Gilbert
 Brown Carroll Brown and Andrew B. Brown to
 have all my lands I want Gilbert Brown to have
 the place he lives on my will is that Carroll
 Brown and Andrew B. Brown to have the place
 I now live on to be equally divided between
 them my will is that Andrew B. Brown

is to have all my mansion houses and also the mill
all to be on his part of the land my will is that my
three sons above named to have them same equally divided
among them in value by making up to each other in case
so that there will be no money to be paid out from
one to the other my will is that each one of the above
named boys are to have an equal share in the mill
by helping to keep it in order my will is that my three
sons above named pay each of them one hundred dollars
out of their own funds to my wife Elizabeth Brown my
reason for this is that the lands I give them is worth that
much more than I have given to Helen John or Martha
in land my will is that Carroll give Andrew J Brown
have a bed and bed clothing with their sled I want
I want to have the headstall that his mother had and also
a little spinning table and each of them to have a cow
and calf which they never had my will is that Gilbert
Brown is to have a negro boy named ~~John~~ and little
George and little Grace at one thousand dollars my will
is that Carroll is to have old George and his wife Lucy
J Simon at one thousand dollars my will is that Andrew
J Brown have the two boys left & wife at one thousand
dollars my son John has had six hundred and I want
my executor to pay him four hundred dollars which will
make him even with the others my will is that Andrew
J Brown have the boy called Abby by his paying John Brown
three hundred dollars my will is that Gilbert or Carroll
keep Jack at one hundred and seventy five dollars by
paying one hundred of it to John Brown as soon as the
money can be collected the other seventy five to be equally
divided among my heirs so that all my negroes above
named can all stay in the neighborhood my will
is that the heirs of Thos G. Allison & Martha Ann
Brown receive an equal share of the two negroes

I leave them at the death of Martha Allison the wife of Thos
G. Allison the said Thos G. Allison is not to have any control
of the said two negroes
Mrs. Lick and Son in any way whatever excepting they
are to work for Martha Allison during her natural life I
do appoint my three sons to act as agents for the heirs of

among my heirs that is living here that she may be
well taken care of as I think it will be best for the
old negro my will is that my sister Alice be sold with
my perishable property and the proceeds be equally
divided among the above named heirs after paying
my beloved wife Elizabeth Brown three hundred
dollars which would make her up the six hundred
that I leave her out of my own funds my will
is that my beloved wife Elizabeth Brown is to have
two hundred pounds of seed cotton that is on hand

and a plentiful year provision I do appoint my three
 sons above named Gilbert Brown Carroll Brown &
 A. S. Brown to execute this my last will this 10th day
 of December in the year of our Lord 1844
