Copy of the last will & testament of Mrs. Hephner Good

I, Melvann Hephners of the County of Lincoln & State of Virginia, do hereby make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following
 1st. I desire that all my just debts of which there has not been and none of large amounts together with my funeral expenses be paid with the crop on hand &
 2ndly I desire that my wife Mary R. Hephners who agreeably to the terms of a conveyance contract made with me on the 16th day of November 1849 is entitled in her right to a child's portion or the fourth part of my estate both real & personal shall be made equal in negro pay with those of my children to whom I have heretofore lent property (intended now to be advancements) in compliance with provision of said contract.

3rdly the property heretofore lent my daughter Charlotte M. Mathews consisting of three negroes valued at one thousand dollars shall be placed in the hands of a trustee for the sole use & benefit of my said daughter Charlotte and her children

4thly the property heretofore lent my daughter Mary Ann Ware of Tennessee consisting of three negroes valued at seven hundred & fifty dollars shall be placed in the hands of a trustee for the sole use and benefit of my said daughter Mary Ann Ware and her children

5thly the property heretofore lent my son John H. Hephners of Tennessee Island at one thousand five hundred & fifty dollars shall be placed in the hands of a trustee for the sole use & benefit of my said son John H. Hephners and his descendants

6thly the property heretofore lent my daughter Helen B. Rhodes of Madison County valued at one thousand five hundred & fifty dollars I give to her & her children

7thly the property heretofore lent my son Nathaniel M. Hephners valued at one thousand five hundred & fifty dollars shall be placed in the hands of a trustee for the sole use and benefit of my said son Nathaniel M. Hephners and his children
 8thly the property heretofore lent my daughter Sarah J. Hollings new married valued at one thousand five hundred dollars shall be placed in the hands of a trustee for the sole use and benefit of the children of my said daughter Sarah J. Hollings and their descendants

1744 The property hereafter set my daughter Elizabeth M. M. Drayman of Louisa County at one thousand two hundred & fifty dollars shall be placed in the hands of a trustee for the sole use & benefit of my said daughter Elizabeth M. Drayman and her children

1744 The property hereafter set my daughter Caroline J. James valued at one thousand five hundred dollars I give to her & her children

1744 I desire that my unfortunate son William J. Hopkins to whom I have hereafter mention given no land property shall have a lot of negroes of a quality and value equal with what I have advanced to each of my children hereafter mentioned; and the property thus allotted shall be placed in the hands of a trustee for the sole use and benefit of my said son William J. Hopkins and his descendants

1744 I desire that my son Samuel A. Hopkins to whom I have hereafter mention given no land property shall have the family of negro family (Leicester City his wife and their children) that I bought of Big Tombo of Louisa value at one thousand four hundred & fifty dollars to make him equal with my other children to whom I have hereafter advanced property; & the property thus allotted shall be placed in the hands of a trustee for the sole use and benefit of my said son Samuel A. Hopkins and his descendants

1744 I desire that those of my negroes that will not be disposed of by the foregoing provisions of my will or that will be left after placing my last wife and all my children (including the children of my daughter Sarah J. Rolling dead) in a will be left to their mother's portion or an equal portion as to property advanced shall be divided among my wife and children hereafter mentioned as to part there all an equal portion in the distribution of both my real and personal estate; and the property to which my daughter M. Hopkins Nathaniel M. Hopkins William J. Hopkins & Samuel A. Hopkins, and my daughter Charlotte M. Mathews Mary Ann Ware and Elizabeth M. M. Drayman and the children of my daughter Sarah J. Rolling dead will be entitled in this division shall be placed in the hands of trustees respectively for the benefit of my said children and the children of my daughter Sarah J. Rolling dead and their descendants. It is my desire in the distribution of my estate both real & personal the children of my daughter Sarah J. Rolling dead shall receive in trust the Eleventh part or that to which their mother would be entitled in an equal division of being and that my said wife Mary P. Hopkins shall have only what the above mentioned contract says for

1744 I desire that my negroes be divided equally among my legatees hereafter mentioned agreeably the provisions in the foregoing items, the money arising from the sale of stocks and vendible part of my estate after the payment of all my just debts as above described

1744 I will and bequeath to a trustee hereafter to be named, for the sole use and benefit of my son Samuel A. Hopkins and his descendants the several tract or which I reside, given me by my father and embracing the mountain from the said trustee to manage the said land for the sole use and benefit of my said son Samuel A. Hopkins and his descendants the business ground being reserved; the use of all my family

1744 I will and bequeath to a trustee hereafter to be named for the sole use and benefit of my son Nathaniel M. Hopkins and William J. Hopkins

my tract of land called Holman, on which my said son Nathaniel M. Hopkins and his children, containing about three hundred acres the said trustee to manage the said land for the sole use and benefit of my said son Nathaniel M. Hopkins and William J. Hopkins and their descendants

1744 I desire that the Willance of the land I own in Virginia, and the estate that I inherited from my brother Thomas Hopkins lying in the death that or estate of whatever nature or kind soever it may be not hereafter disposed of, shall be divided among my wife and children hereafter mentioned, so as to make them all equal in the distribution of both my real and personal estate (the children of my daughter Sarah J. Rolling dead, receiving their mother's portion) either by selling the lands and other property and dividing the money among them, or dividing the lands and other property among them, as my executor hereafter appointed, may think best, or may require; and the interest of my wife and each of my said children respectively included in this item shall go to them and be held by them equally in the same manner as the negro property that I have herein before given them and in order that there may be an equal distribution of my estate both real and personal (as hereafter stated) among my said wife and children the lands given in trust to my son Samuel A. Hopkins Nathaniel M. Hopkins and William J. Hopkins in the 15th and 16th items of this my last will and testament shall be valued

1744 I desire that if the trustee or trustees respectively confided with the property of my children by the provision of this will, think any part of the said property may advantageously be sold or exchanged, and the legal and so much there, such part may be sold or exchanged by the said trustee and the money or property received instead, shall be vested in and held by the said trustee exactly as the original property was. It is also my desire that immediately on the death of any of my children or the children of my daughter Sarah J. Rolling dead, and in her or their portion of my estate shall be divided among her or their descendants pro stirpe, or if he she or they have no descendants then among my other children or their descendants pro stirpe the children of my said daughter Sarah J.
