to one hundred & eighty acres of land on big mountains being the plantation whereon I now live to him
and his heirs for ever and likewise all the remaining part of my personal estate except a small
sum & the price of two years schooling which I give to Anna Moore who is now at school with the
reserve that my wife beloved wife Agnes shall have & enjoy one full third part of my estate both
real & personal during her natural life and at her decease said her young children her husband to whom
she is betrothed. Lastly I do nominate & appoint my son Samuel Hardy John Adams & Lewis Montgomery
executors of this my last will & testament & authorize all & every after will or wills whatsoever by me
hereafter made by or under the seal published & acknowledged by the said John Adams to be his last will and
testament in person &

 weakness of life and feeling that all flesh is subject to mortality as it is of practice one for
 all men to die do think it necessary in order to secure my temporal affairs in as settled way & settle
 as possible to make a last will & testament which after recommending my soul to God who gave it
 with deliberation and a humble resignation I will as followeth (Viz) That all My Last will & testament
 due and owing shall & may be satisfied and paid in convenient time after My decease by My ex-
 cutors hereafter named Item I give & bequeath to My dear John McEwen to him his heirs and
 assigns forever the land whereon I now live with the improvements thereunto belonging containing
 by estimation one hundred and eighty acres of or more land with this reserve that My wife Margaret
 McEwen shall have use and enjoy one third part of said land including the house in payment
 during her widowhood Item I give & bequeath to My Son George McEwen to him his heirs
 and assigns for ever one hundred and twenty five acres of land here by two deeds appertaining the
 above mentioned lands also My wife is that My Son John shall pay out of his joint and several
 and ten pounds which shall be equally divided between My two sons Samuel McEwen & Robert
 McEwen where My wife is that My Son George shall pay seventy pounds to be equally
 divided between the above named sons Viz Samuel & Robert Item My wife is that My
 personal estate shall not be exposed to sale but shall remain in the hands of the executor for the
 benefit of My family till they are of age also My wife is that is My daughter Sarah McEwen
 shall remain in her father's house when she is of age at the discretion of My executor according to the
 property they have then in their hands and in order to provide for a child that is yet unborn My
 wife is of it shewed in a way that it shall be made good in part to My other boys that have
 no lands by each of the four paying a proportionable part out of their share to him -
 And if it should be a girl to then upon a will with My above mentioned daughter Sarah
 and as to My personal estate My wife is that it be divided amongst My children when they
 come of age at the discretion of My executor. Lastly I do nominate and appoint John
 Mathew Andrew Hannah & My wife beloved wife Margaret McEwen counties of
 this My last will & testament and revoking all and every other will or wills
 whatever by me heretofore made signed sealed published & acknowledged by the testator
