

Ezekiel Lyon's Will

that if in her judgment the interest of my family may so require she be empowered to sell or dispose of the Land or plantation on which she now lives & use the proceeds of said sale for the best interests of the family as she may judge fit & proper - Item 2nd I will and bequeath to my son Samuel E. Lyon a good saddle horse worth at the usual rates of horses at this time, fifty or sixty dollars in cash to be valued to him by two disinterested persons our Chosen by him & one by my executors - Item 3rd It is my wish that the greater proportion of the plantation be given to my two younger sons Wilson and Franklin & if it should be thought best to sell it first that the proceeds of the sale be so divided as to give them the greater part - Provided their conduct & behaviour be such as in the opinion of their Mother to warrant such a bequestment. If not I wish her empowered to make other division of the same - Item 4th I will my daughter Amanda to have such a portion of the land or its proceeds or an equivalent of other property as her mother & my other Executor may consider an equitable division with Wilson and Franklin Lyon according to Item third of my will - Item 5th I do hereby appoint and retain my wife Polly Lyon & Wilson Lyon the executors of this my last will and testament - Signed & sealed the day and date above written

2nd I desire that my funeral expenses be paid and all other just debts & necessities seen to -

3rd That Rebecca Cochran have a note I hold on the estate of George Cochran deceased -

4th In Sarah Cochran I give and bequeath my bureau and one feather bed with its furniture it being at Ebenezer Barkley the one with the trifid bidding, also one hair trunk & all its contents except papers -

5th One other bed & bedding that is at Ebenezer Barkley I give & bequeath to Delilah Emeline Barkley -

6th One bedstead & bedding, the one I lay out to Sarah Jane Barkley daughter of John Barkley also my saddle -

7th I give & bequeath to Emeline Barkley, dear daughter of John Barkley, one small table and candle stand that is at Ebenezer Barkley -

8th That all my accounts with Daniel Barkley having been settled except thirty dollars which was forgotten in our last settlement which I owe him and desire to (be) paid -

9th The balance of my effects being in notes I desire that they be collected & distributed equally after paying Jacob C. Cochran one hundred dollars, between Iselin Cochran Daniel Cochran, Franklin & Cochran Saml C. Cochran, Sarah Jane King daughter of Edward King, Sarah Ann Patton, Mary Garrison, Sarah Jane Bright, Delilie Gammon, Susannah Barkley, daughter of Elizabeth Barkley Kentucky and Sarah Martin daughter of E. S. & Mary Martin - Lastly I appoint Ebenezer Barkley my Executor - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
