My son Michael is to have from a little spring above the dam a straight line to a corner stone then including both the east line & the south line the balance said Charles is to pay Polly thirty dollars and George thirty dollars and Michael is to pay Rachel fifty dollars a piece and of my personal estate I give my daughter Polly her bed & furniture and my daughter Rachel her bed & bedding & Mary her bed furniture when ever they call for the same & give to my son William five dollars & my son John five dollars & after my wife decease I give my three daughters Polly & Rachel & Mary and my son William and my son John an equal divide of all my personal property and the remainder of my goods & chattels I give to my wife whom I hereby appoint sole executrix of this my last will & testament hereby revoking all my former wills by me made In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 31st day of September 1814.
