testimony of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die & to render to him
my last will & testament that is to say principally and first of all I give & recommend my soul into the
hands of almighty god that gave it and my body I recommend to his earth to be buried in decent
Christian burial at the direction of my executors Nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I
shall receive the same again by the Mighty Power of God. and as touching such worldly estate whereto
at both places god to bless me with in this life. I give devise & dispose of the same in the
following Manner & Form First I give & bequeath to Elizabeth English my dearly beloved wife
whom I Chose to be my last wife & Companion with all the Estate I have in English my beloved son the sole
executors of this my last will & testament all and singular my houses & tenements by him
freely to be possessed by him during his Natural life or widowhood but if she Marries then to have
an equal part with her and my Children that were left at my decease & each Child to have
an equal part as if the should survive my widow till death then the remaining part of my
estate to be divided or sold & equally divided amongst my Children & each Child & every child
wishes & demands all & every other former testaments wills & bequests & accounts by me in any way
before names called or requested & signed & confirmed this & the other to be my last will & testament
writing which I have hereunto set my hand & seal this twenty third day of October in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred & fifteen. Signed sealed published & declared before me Thomas English as last
will & testament in the presence of us who is his personal & in the presence of each other have hereunto subscribed

William Fairwell

In the name of God Amen, December the 20th 1812.

I William Pain of the County of Washington and State of Tennessee, being weak in body but of sound mind and memory and calling to mind that it is appointed for all men to die Do constitute and Ordain this my last will and Testament, touching every thing - And as touching what mortal Estate it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner, first I will that all my just debts be paid and satisfied, then I give and bequeath to my Son George Pain 200.00 of hand lying on him whosoever he may be as to include part of a new survey I also give to my son John Pain a tract of Land, beginning at the house end of the upper meadow fence, running in a direction so as to include 1/2 Apple tree and through a "span" of Bay at the upper end of P meadow, thence running north & goes to the right hand line of the other a few hundred feet, thence north & line line it including the Western tract, thence starting in the beginning corner on P meadow fence thence north the fence opposite to what there is a little Negro house, thence crossing the fence and running up a bank to a small Chestnut thence running with the direction of the fence till it strikes William Thompson's line thence running round to the beginning the balance of my Land I leave to my Son Samuel. I leave to my wife a Negro girl named Fanny and a choir of my stock of horses and a saddle and I much and the bought of the farm during his natural life I also leave to Cassima Young a Mulatto Boy called David and when she reaches the P. Day she is to pay back 50 dollars to be equally divided between the other 4 Daughters I also leave to my Daughter Sally a Negro girl named Fabin also to my Son Gray a Negro girl named Delate I also leave to my Daughter Betty Ann a Negro girl named Charles I also leave to my Daughter Nancy a Negro girl named Melley. I further give to my son John a bill of blacksmith tools, I also leave to my son Samuel my Bed and bed room. I leave to my son David Pain 200 dollars as I leave in a bill balance of my money to be equally divided between all my Daughters I further wish my youngest Daughter to be made equal with the others to be raised out of my stock and household furniture, I also leave to my wife as much of the balance of my household furniture as she wishes to keep and the residue to be equally divided between my 5 Daughters and also all the balance of my stock of every description, I further will my farming utensils of every description to be equally divided amongst all my sons I also leave my title to my Son Samuel and he is to take the Chain and maintain his Mother and Grand Mother during their lives and I appoint my trust Friends Samuel Pain and Robert Gray sole Executors of this my last will and Testament.
