Ferguson that later half sold by John Carmichael and George Carmichael - I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Larina Carmichael all of my stock of my kind and all my personal property together with my house hold and kitchen furniture and all my farming utensils of every kind to hold during her life time and then to fall to Isabella Spears and Archibald Carmichael if they separate the old woman -

Lastly I nominate and appoint Jeremiah H. Sherfy to carry this will into effect and direct that he be permitted to act as such without security given under my hands and seal this 4th August 1856.
