dollars in trade at trade rates also pay John Adair fifty dollars in trade at trade
rates also pay Polly Sporn twenty five dollars in trade at trade rates and the following
bequests are to be given to my son the said James Adair (wants) My daughter Sarah is
to be paid in three years after my decease and her Mother's decease - also My daughter Lane
to be paid in four years after our decease also My son John is to be paid in five years
after our decease and my daughter Polly is to be paid in six years after our decease -
Also I will & bequeath to My son James all My stock of horses cattle sheep & hogs My
farming utensils one pot one sled iron My arm Chair and the Books called the testamentary
confession of faith and David Balms and he the said James Adair is to carry us of his
own expense and Elyhu Sporn and Polly to the their Mother's Graveyard as long as they
live in the county - And lastly I do hereby appoint & constitute My younger Sons
Adair and Jane Alexander executors of this My last will and testament
and hereby revoking all other or former wills or testaments by me herebefore
