

Jane Nelson Will

In the Name of God Amen.

I Jane Nelson of the County of Washington in the State of Tennessee
being weak in body but of a sound mind & memory doth by god calling to mind the uncertainty of
life and the certainty of death do on this fourth day of November One Thousand One Thousand
Eighty Nine now make this my last will & testament in manner following and first I
do declare that all my just debts be fully satisfied and paid and all the remainder of my estate
I gather since the death of my husband Henry Nelson and not willed by him to any of his
children or to others to be divided as follows — Then I give & bequeath unto my daughter
Elizabeth Tyler all my weasery apparel — Then I give & bequeath my Negro Children
to each Elizabeton Isaac Humphrey Rebecca & William together with any child or children that
my Negro women Slave Sarah may have before my decease to be equally divided between
my four sons (viz) William Henry John & Charles Nelson or so to be divided that each
of them may have a proportionable part — of the real value of them —
to them I give and bequeath all the remainder of my estate as mention above to be
equally divided between my four sons above named proportioned as above
and I do hereby constitute and appoint my son John Nelson to be executor of this
my test will and testaments revoking and disannulling all and every other will
or be wills by me heretofore made ratifying publishing and sealing this to be
my test will and testaments and none other — Signed sealed & acknowledged
by the said Jane Nelson as her last will and testaments in presence of us who
do bear all witness at the signing sealing and acknowledging thereof

In the State of Tennessee
Washington County April the tenth in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and six whereas it is appointed for all men once to die I thought it right and
proper to make this my last will & testament being in right mind and memory
and I do desire that it may be as followeth (viz) I desire that my lawful wife
Margaret Cash may have all my land that I possess where I now live and all my
and chattels which I now possess and Negroes after my lawfull being paid until
the day of her death and after her death the property that I shall mention shall be
divided to my children and the rest to be sold at twelve months credit and a sum
as my executors can collect it to be given to my children as I shall direct —
first I give eldest son Elisha 3 dollars to his share with one half of my books —
I give unto my son James Cash one hundred dollars worth publishing my books to his share
I give my son John Cash fifty acres of land which he has already set aside to him

you unto my daughter Sally Thomas three dollars to her two sons William & Isaac thirty five dollars
each for their part — I give unto my son William Cash what he has now got a sum for fifty acres
less and also 98 dollars for his share — I give to my son Leonard Cash fifty dollars for his share —
I give to my son Thomas Cash two hundred dollars for his share — I give unto my son Jerome
three hundred dollars for his share — I give to my daughter Margaret Cash forty dollars
Sally should have another child after soon, my desire is that my daughter Patsy shall have the
give my daughter Patsy Anderson one Negro Woman Lucy and her son Sam if Lucy should have
my man before my wife death then my wife shall give it to him she has property
give my son Benjamin Cash one Negro Man named Cleon — I give my son Astbury Cash
one Negro Man named Moses — If there should be any money left after the will is paid there being
be equally divided between Benjamin & Astbury Cash — I also do desire that my lawfull wife
may and Cash and my son Benjamin Cash with my trusty friend William Calvert Jr. May act
My executors as for their power is agreeable to this my last will and testaments as witness
do hereunto set my hand an affix my seal the day & date first above written Sealed by
the prescriber of us — My desire is that if Patsy Anderson should die before her husband
John and having no heir of her body her property which I have given them my two sons
Benjamin & Astbury may have it equally divided between them both —

John Ferguson Will

In the Name of God Amen

I John Ferguson of the State of Tennessee & County of Washington
being weak in body but perfectly sound in mind & memory calling to remembrance Mortality
that it is appointed unto man once to die and after death the judgment I do appoint & desire
to establish this to be my last will & testaments hereby revoking & disannulling all former wills
and bequests whatevver — And first I do resign my body to the dust to be buried
a decent and Christian like manner at the discretion of my executors and my soul to god
I give it nothing doubting but that I shall receive the same again at the general resurrection
as touching my worldly estate which with god in his providence has been pleased to bestow upon
me I do appoint & desire of in the manner and form following that is to say
in the first place will that all my just debts be fully discharged — And secondly I leave
a bequest to my beloved wife Jane Ferguson the rest of the dwelling house that she shall
use to live in during her Natural life and all the furniture that now is hers together with
one and two sheep which are the shall choose and all my part of the grain and hay that is
now in the barn and the fields likewise ten of the apple trees such as the may bear as also
a pound worth of other necessaries such as the shall stand in need of for a sufficient quantity
as much place taken as the shall stand in need of for her own use — Thirdly I give
my executors the power to sell the same for the payment of my debts
