I Nathan Nelson of Washington State of Wash you being
very sick & weak in body bed of a perfect mind & memory & thankful to god for the
same calling into mind the Mortality of my body & knowing that it is approaches nigh
Men Once to die I do make & desire this my last will and testament that is to say
properly and first of all I give & command my body into the hands of Almighty God
that gave it and my body to come to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian
manner at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the general
resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and at the day
such worldly estate wherewithal I hath pleased god to bless me with in this life
I give devise & dispose of in the following manner and from first whereof My son
John Nelson has received three hundred dollars and my wife is that he receive no
more until the rest of the sum remain their part which shall be hereafter mentioned
in the肆t of my test. wife Elizabeth and further my son Isaac Nelson shall
have three hundred dollars and to have the mill until the youngest heir comes of
age by giving one fourth of the income of the same for the support of the younger
children and to keep the Mill in good repair and also he is to have that part of the
Meadow that lies over the branch that the Mill and also four acres of ground
adjoining the Mill what property he is to have after the youngest heir comes of
age and no longer also my daughter Rachael Deakins wife of Charles Deakins She
has received eighty one dollars there is winter fodder to get coming to her to take her
out of the estate and further she is to have an equal share with the rest of the heirs
or will be here after mentioned and further my will is that my daughter Hannah
Shall have one hundred dollars or that amount in good property as she and the
executors can agree and then to have no more until the rest of my female
heirs comes of age and made equal to one hundred dollars each and then if no
balance shall remain provision will hereafter be made & further Nathan
Nelson & James Nelson my sons that is not done.

Nathan Nelson's Will

With my daughters each of these five test. female children is to receive the sum of one
hundred dollars as they come of age subject nevertheless to an equal divide of the balance of the
estate that may remain after then at the period of time my wife is that my heirs both male &
female shall have an equal shares of the balance of the estate that remain & further my
will is that all my movable property be sold agreeable to law except the bed & furniture
which I bequeath to my daughters Nancy Hannah Thenza and Ruth and the money arising
out of the sale of the above property is to be put to interest until the youngest
heir comes of age and further my will is that the plantation be divided to the best advan-
tage and the rest of the same be put to the best advantage for the benefit of the heirs
until they may all come of age and then my will is that the plantation be sold
to the best advantage and then all the money due to the estate shall be equally divided amongst the
heirs both male & female and as a further confirmation of my last will & testament I do
ordain and appoint as my executors James Deakins John Nelson & Isaac Nelson my sons
with this further my further request that the care of my Captain children that are yet incapable
of taking care of themselves. In witness whereof I have here set my hand and affixed my seal

Margaret Mather & Mary Snapp all my wearing apparel all my household & kitchen
furniture of every description with all the money that may belong to my estate or that in any
way be due to the same at my decease or that may be made from the sale of any of the personal
property belonging to my estate which is left by this will bequeathed which shall remain

I Adam Wattentong Et. of the County of Washington and State of Pennsylvania being of advanced age, professing a sound mind, calling to mind my Mortality, do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament, revoking all former Wills and Testaments as followeth My Jordan that my Mortality pasting after deferring the expenses of a decent and Christian funeral of my Body and payment of all my just debts be distributed as follow. Inasmuch I bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Elizabeth Wattentong all my Household & Kitchen furniture, Bed & furniture to be for her use and all farming utensils until my youngest child comes of age. It is my will to keep all my Stock of horses, cows, hogs and Sheep and all other perishable property for the use of my wife to raise the family until the youngest child comes of age and as my children come to age each one of them hereafter mentioned shall have a horse worth between fifty and sixty Dollars and common saddle and bridle a sum of my Sons I am had horses saddle and bridle worth the amount above mentioned is not William Wattentong, Isaac Wattentong and Peter Wattentong So it is my will that these three mentioned shall have a horse saddle and bridle at the same prices as they come Land, Solomon Michael, Frederick, George, Dennis Wattentong (now it is my will that my daughters Elizabeth Wattentong and Sally Wattentong as they arrive at the age of eighteen years to have each of them a saddle worth twenty Dollars and each of them the sum one each of them fifty Dollars sum never failing, and each a bed and furniture and bedding well. And it is my will that my Son Solomon Wattentong on the account of bodily infirmity to have one hundred Dollars out of the first monies that is collected to be applied for his education and this is to be extra from an equal share with the rest of the Legatees and it is my will that four Boys, Frank, Michael, Francis, George & Samuel Wattentong be sent to school to learn, write and understand the Rule of Three and it is my will that my two Daughters Elizabeth & Sarah be sent to school to learn to read and write and for the above mentioned four Boys and two Girls for their education to be paid out of my estate and if my wife Elizabeth should depart this life before my youngest child comes of age all my property both real and personal shall be sold at public sale and as my Son Peter Wattentong learned the Blacksmith trade, there is to be one hundred dollars deducted out of his share of his legacy and of my wife's share till my youngest child comes to be of age. In shall have my common cupboards and furniture, Clocks, case, an Barrow, two milk Cows, one mare and saddle bridle, an Bed and furniture, an copper kettle and as much household and kitchen furniture as may be necessary to supply houses and for her dress all to be sold and equally divided among the Legatees. All the money thus raised from the plantation that is sold to John Melton and what is not due as soon as can be collected and the debt paid the balance to be divided among the Legatees, then pay to have their part that are not of age the money to be put to interest until they arrive at age.
