And I give and bequeath to my Son Ebenezer Fair 200 acres of land lying on Rte Chester line running so as to include part of a new Survey I also give to my Son Tom Fair a tract of Land beginning at the house end of the Apple Meadow fence running in a direction so as to include 4 Apple trees and through a pass of Way at the right end of P Meadow thence running with the fence to the right hand the C. thence a four hundred acre tract thence back & line it including the Weston tract then starting on the beginning corner in P Meadow fence thence with the fence opposite to which there is a little sugar bush thence crossing the fence and running up a bank to a small Chestnut tree running with the direction of the fence till it strikes William Thompsons line thence running down to the beginning of the balance of my Land given to my Son Samuel. I leave to my wife a Negro girl named Lucy and a child of my Stock of horses and a saddle and 2 Milch cows and the benefit of the farm during her natural life I also leave to Priscilla Young a Middie Boy called David and when she reaches the P. Boy she is to pay back 50 dollars to be equally divided between the other 4 daughters I also leave to my Daughter Sally a Negro girl named Sallie also to Betsy Gray a Negro girl named Octavia I also leave to my Daughter Polly Ann a Negro girl named Charita I also leave to my Daughter Nancy a Negro girl named Nelly I further give to my Son John a set of blacksmith tools I also leave to my Son Daniel my Bed and Bedding. I leave to my Son David Fair 200 dollars in Silver as a the balance of my Money to be equally divided between all my Daughters I further wish my 3 youngest daughters to be made equal with the oldest to be raised out of my Stock and Household furniture I also leave to my wife as much of the balance of my Household furniture as she wishes to keep now the residue to be equally divided between my 5 daughters and also all the balance of my Stock of every description. I further wish my farm utensils of every description to be equally divided amongst all my Sons I also leave my Stock to my Son Samuel and he is to take the Charge and maintain his Mother and Grand mother during their lives and appoint my three Daughters Sarah and Robert Gray both Executrix of this my last will and Testament
