the house hold and kitchen furniture thereunto pertain-
ing during her life. And I will and bequeath to my daugh-
-ter Elizabeth and child to wait upon her during her life
3^d My wife to be an equal heir with my children to all my
real and personal estate not before bequeathed with such
exceptions as shall be made hereafter 4th To my children
Leith H Heuley, Dorcas H Heuley, Thomas P Heuley
Louise Brown, Mary Heuley and B Heuley equal shares
of all my real estate including besides the home tract the
tract upon which my mother lives adjoining the lands of
Joshua Heuley, Jacob F. Brumley and others

5th The boys Aaron and Houston to be sold and the proceeds to be equally distributed among my children 6th The cash and notes to be divided equally among my wife and children

I hereby Appoint Jonathan S. Hensley and Thomas R. Hensley my Sons Executors of this my last Will and Testament and in justice to my other Children they are required to give such Security as shall be approved by the County Court.

I, John Cook, in the name of God Amen, being of Washington County Grand Juror and military collector, to mind the certainty of death and the uncertainty of this mortal life do hereby make, certify and constitute this now first will and testament: hereby revoking all former wills either verbal or written by me at any time made in manner and form following, viz:—

1st after my personal witness are destroyed I wish all my just debts to be paid out of my estate. — 2nd I give and bequeath unto my two sons Archibald & James C. Seale at my death the tract of land that I bought of Mrs. Powell the one & nine five up or, containing twenty eight acres more or less, by the said Archibald & James C. Seale paying to Mrs. Powell the daughter Elizabeth and Mary, one hundred dollars apiece in current bank notes when my sons to be eighteen years of age; also that they pay the Board of Trustees of Washington College twenty five dollars in current bank notes in the term of five years. — 3rd I also give the said Archibald & James C. Seale in full possession of the South end of my home they are also to have the management of the farm by them furnished for as long as they are necessary for a decent and comfortable habitation.
