I John Hunter of the State of Georgia, County of Washington
Black Smith being in perfect health of body, also in perfect mind & memory therefore do give
to God, calling unto me the mortality of my body and knowing that it is impossible for all
men once to die in this world this my last will & testament that it be so principally
and first of all given & remitted the substance of all my lands of whatsoever kind that year it
and my body I command to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion
of the executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again
by the mighty power of God and in looking such willingly unto death it has pleased God
to bring me in this life to give & bequeath to the same in the following manner & form
in such simple and familiar language first being placed - I give and bequeath unto my beloved
wife Barbara Hunter a Negro Slave & her services out of the above & movable effects during her
natural life - In like manner give & bequeath to the beloved children Isaac Hunter
and Barbara Hunter one hundred pounds worth to be paid in Trade equal to each at their
dealing for bushels to be paid to them by my executors out of my movable effects after
the death of my wife - And the rest of my children having received one hundred
pounds each in out to remain a proportional part with the whole of their Brother
and Sister I therefore bequeath that after the death of my wife the property
herefore named the residue of my property shall be exposed to public sale at a
reasonable credit at the discretion of my executors and the money equally divided
among the whole of my children I likewise constitute & appoint William
Hunter and Joseph Hunter the sole executors of this my last will & testament
and I the said John Hunter do hereby declare this and no other to be my last
will and testament In writing whereof I do hereunto set my hand and
seal this twenty fifth day of February in the thirty second year of America
independance and in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred
and nine signed sealed published and declared by the said John
Hunter as his last will and testament in the presence of us who
in his presence have inserted our names

I wish that my executors of my last will & testament faithfully execute my will &
my relation to said Bill, and promise her emancipation according to the terms of the testator
hereby, and as William Hunter the above named executor is about to remove from
this State (if he should) I nominate John G. Harris as an executor in the same manner &

servants belonging to each during her life and at her death she shall have the liberty to carry
the furniture among all her children also my Negro boy Tom to be on the farm and the other
of my son William 2^d I give & bequeath to my son Nathaniel Blackburn one horse and saddle
to be worth one hundred dollars 3^d I give & bequeath to my son Benjamin Blackburn two
horses in property at the Market price 4^d I give & bequeath to my son Archimel Blackburn
one hundred acres of land of the upper end of my plantation adjoining the head of the river of Middle
Woods R. 5^d I give & bequeath unto my daughter Rosannah McRae one hundred and fifty
dollars in property at the Market price 6^d I give & bequeath to my son William Blackburn
all the remainder of my plantation including all the buildings thereon & farm utensils but his
Mother is to have his paper while he lives and he to maintain her in security while she
lives also my Negro boy Tom after his Mother's death 7^d I give & bequeath to my daughter
Polyanna fifty dollars in property at the Market price 8^d I give & bequeath to my son
Thomas Blackburn one horse and saddle worth twenty dollars in value
9^d I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Blackburn one Mare Calves Name
four heads of cattle two cows and two young cattle one horse & furniture
four hundred dollars in property at the Market Price 10^d I give & bequeath to my
son Archimel Blackburn one horse & saddle worth twenty five dollars and two
hundred dollars in horses at the Market price and finally I give & bequeath
all the debts due unto me after my just debts are paid out of it to be carried
over
