

Sarah Hunt's Will

I Sarah Hunt of Washington County and State of Tennessee, do make and publish this as my last Will and Testament, and do hereby revoke all other wills by me at any time heretofore made.

First; I direct, that my funeral expenses be first paid out of my estate, together with all just debts that may be against my Estate at the time of my death; by my Executor hereinafter named, out of the first moneys that may ^{first} come into his hands.

Second; I will and bequeath unto my Son Samuel Hunt five hundred Dollars, to be paid to him by my Executor.

Third; I will and bequeath unto my son James S. Hunt the one half of a note will'd to me by my husband Samuel Hunt Dec'd, on Wm H. Crutch calling for two hundred and ninety five dollars & fifty nine cents, the part intended for James S. Hunt being one hundred and forty eight dollars and twenty nine cents, with Interest from the time said Note fell due until collected and paid over to him.

Fourth; I will and bequeath unto my three Sons Franklin Hunt James S. Hunt and Samuel Hunt the proceeds of a note on Wm H. Crutch calling for one hundred and seventy eight Dollars, with a credit on the same of forty Dollars, to be divided as follows, Franklin Hunt to have the one third of said note charging him with thirty Dollars already received, James S. Hunt, or third and Samuel Hunt the balance.

Fifth; I will and bequeath unto my Son Samuel Hunt, all of my household and kitchen furniture of every description, and also my undivided interest in all the horses, cattle, hogs, sheep and other stock, now on the farm of which I may die seized and possessed, which Interest being one third, as will'd to me by my husband Samuel Hunt Dec'd, and also the one third of the farming utensils now in use on the farm of the said Samuel Hunt, to have and to hold the one third with Franklin Hunt and James S. Hunt. I also will and bequeath to my Son Samuel Hunt, all debts due to me, or due to the Estate of my husband the said Samuel Hunt Dec'd, of which I may die seized and possessed, including debts due by note or otherwise, and moneys that may be in hands at my death.

Sixth; I hereby will and bequeath unto my Son James S. Hunt, all of the present Crop, including Wheat, oats and hay made and taken care of - and also the Corn now growing.

Lastly - I hereby nominate and appoint my Son Samuel Hunt Executor of this my last Will and Testament.

Thomas Gibson's Will

I Thomas Gibson do make and publish this my last Will and Testament.

First - I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any moneys that may be possessed of, or may first come into the hands of my Executor. Secondly I give and bequeath unto my Wife Sarah Gibson all the lands and stock and household and kitchen furniture and farming utensils and blacksmith tools at the death of my wife. Thirdly I bequeath to my Son William Gibson Beginning at Blackoak and running to the Poirs hill thence along the top of the ridge a strake line to the back line, Fourthly, I bequeath to my Son Josiah Gibson Beginning on a Stake on William's line on the north side of the middle point near the pearce spring to a stake thence with the fence ~~up~~ across the field to a stake thence with the fence to the back line. Fifth I bequeath to my daughter Kennedy Gibson Beginning at stake the last one on Goswell line and running a strake line to Francis Williams line to a fine corner. Sixth I bequeath to my daughter Minerva Gibson Beginning at stake on Williams line and running up the Hollow a strake line to a Maple, thence a strake line to a Spanish oak on Williams line. Seventh I bequeath to my daughter Eliza Beth Gibson the Remainder including the Buildings where I now live. - Eighth I give and bequeath to my two sons, Pleasant Gibson and Lewis Gibson that forty acres of land on Parnish Creek adjoining the lands of Henry King and Henry Robinson shall be sold and the proceeds be Equally divided between them two. The Ninth I give and bequeath the Blacksmith Tools and one set of ~~horns~~ ^{horns} and farm utensils and stocks shall be equal divided between my sons. The Tenth I give and bequeath that the three daughters after the death of their mother the household and kitchen furniture shall be equal divided between them. I do hereby nominate and appoint Vincent Perry my Executor in witness whereof I do to this my will set my hand and seal this the 29 day of March 1852.
