The foregoing will was proven in Court by the Oath of John Nelson David Nelson John and David Brown two of the subscribing witnesses thereto at October Term 1823 & recorded. John Mathis one of the executors of the foregoing will was qualified to execute the same

Sacob Kiplings Will

In the name of God Amen I Sabob Kipling of Washington County & State of Tennessee being in sound mind health but Colly to mind the certainty of death and the uncertainty of life do on the 10th day of May 1817 Make this my last will & testament in manner and form following. I give bequeath unto my wife Mary Kipling all my estate during her life and at her death to equally divide among my three children. And as much as I have given unto my sons Samuel & John Kipling five hundred dollars each in the form of three plantations which they now live and have paid unto my daughter Betty Straninger and others old debts in cash and property and also have given my daughter Mary Kipling four hundred and fifty dollars in the form of a plantation it is my will after my death & the death of my wife that those who have received more than five hundred dollars in the value of their plantations being the more except what they have paid to the husband of me & my wife whilst we are living do unto each child equal they should pay in property unto those who may not have received a share and whatever remains of my estate after the death of myself & wife be equally divided among my two sons and three daughters. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth the plantation which I now live adjoining the land of Eli Coanier the death and other with the equal proportion of property which may remain after the death of myself and wife. And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my sons Samuel Kipling & John Kipling executors of this my last will & testament and do revoke all former wills made by me declaring this to be my last will & testament signed sealed and acknowledged by the testator in his last will & testament in the presence of us

David & Deadricks Will

In the name of God Amen I David Deadrick of the Town of Lewisburg Washington County & State of Tennessee being in good health sound mind Memory & understanding but considering the uncertainty of life do make this my last will and testament in the manner & form following (to wit) In the first place I command my soul to God who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named, My worldly estate with which I have been possessed I give & dispose of in the following manner (to wit) I give & bequeath to my wife beloved wife Margaretta Deadrick the house and lot we now possess in the town house & goods it contains and all the stock now in my possession which have been sold to me in my dealings at the place (to wit) one thousand dollars which is to be appraised to the payment of my debts together with all the lots and parts of lots with their improvements down in the town of Lewisburg. I also give my wife Margaretta all heavy part of our household furniture implements & household goods together with a stock of every description which I own in the said town of Lewisburg. I further bequeath unto my beloved wife Margaretta the following slaves (to wit) Bartley help, Neptune help & Betty the two former Kinder & Cady I recommend to the indulgence they have enjoyed for several years unto to Kinder I have long since given freedom and when ever he shall be disposed to return my promise it is my wish he shall be free. It is also my will & desire that my beloved wife continue to be supported & comforted the remainder of her life by my son David Deadrick & daughter John Deadrick & James W. Deadrick while they survive at the age of twenty one years. It is also my will & desire that all my debts shall be paid with as little delay as possible & after the said debts are paid that my Executors hereafter to be named will dispose of all my remaining property consisting of horses & lots in Lewisville with my interest in the slave state that I have the sum of Deadrick & Deadrick also a plantation in Green County lying on the waters of Cove Creek containing about three hundred acres of land and one other tract in said County on the waters of Salt Creek containing about sixty acres of land also the land & improvements down in Hawkins County and Jefferson County generally known by the name of Chucks Creek roads together with my interest in the town of Lewisburg in the form of David Deadricks & son including all the debt owing or coming to me at that place with all the stock & other property belonging to me on said place also my plantation with two or three miles of Lewisburg on the County of Washington & State of Tennessee lying on the waters of Salt Creek adjoining the lands of Peter Keller Stephen B. Mathews and others containing about two hundred acres of land also a small tract unimproved within one & a half miles of Lewisburg in said County of Washington adjoining the lands of John Smith John Tharney & others containing about eighty acres more. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth D. Deadrick my share in certain property provided W. Garrett his former Master gives to or claim him equal to a written agreement I have entered into with him thereof known or seen by me. I give unto my daughter Elizabeth D. Deadrick in full of claims the sum of hundred dollars which said Garrett is bound to pay on his last claim being allowed to him the said Garrett. I also give unto my said daughter Elizabeth D. Deadrick the sum of one thousand dollars which together with an equal sum of my other property is to be added to the amount at the age of twenty years. The whole of my remaining property property of what I have bequeathed to my wife I wish to be divided equally among all my children viz. Wm. D. Deadrick David D. Deadrick James D. Deadrick Elizabeth D. Deadrick John D. Deadrick & James W. Deadrick according to my former just names children together with the share amount for property I have bequeathed to them also according to the value of the same
