I Anthony McNeill of the State of Tennessee & County of Washington being very sick & weak of body but of perfect mind & memory thanks be given unto God hereby make known the validity of my body & knowing that it is expedient for all men and for the sake of my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it & my body I recommend to the earthly authorities in due Christian burial at the direction of my executors hereby doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God & as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life after all last debts & charges expenses paid I give devise and dispose of in the following manner of form First I will and grant freedom unto Mrs. Rogers & her heirs I will provide she possess the property security by law required in case of emancipation. Secondly I give & bequeath unto my wife beloved daughter Jane Rapier a sum of money to be raised & have out of my estate equal to the value of a certain tract of land which I formerly gave to Alexander Ferguson his wife to my daughter Polly Ferguson which land shall be value at an equal rate with the coming tract of my plantation after which I give & bequeath unto my two orphaned & wife beloved daughters all the remainder of my estate lands goods & chattels of which the whole have both of them an equal share to be fully possessed and enjoyed by them. Lastly I constitute make & assign my two living friends Thomas Ferguson and David Rapier executors of this my last will & testament and I do hereby certify as above recited and demand all and every other person testaments wills legacies bequests & executor by me in any way before named wills & bequests satisfying the said no other to be my last will & testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this tenth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen signed sealed published and declared by the said Anthony McNeill as his last will & testament in the presence of us who in his presence and in the presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names

I give & bequeath as follows I give to my daughter Hannah Barnum that tract of land known by the woods place & half of the Allison tract as far as the antebellum line I give & bequeath to my daughter Rachel Thompson that tract of land known by the woods place & half of the Allison tract as far as the antebellum line I give & bequeath to my daughter Polly Duncanson that tract of land known by the woods place also my right & interest to the Clinton place also my negro boy called George I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann Thompson one half of that tract of land known by the name of the Hills place which is in part between me & Jonathan Barcroft and one half of the Clinton tract as far as the antebellum line — and as for Emory my wish is that he should be free and his price and all the money in hand or due to me by notes or in any other way belonging to me I wish to be equally divided between my four daughters Hannah Rachel Polly and Ann and as for the stock on hand after Joseph Duncanson third is taken out it is my wish that the four hundred dollars for which I hold a note should be made out of the stock and the money divided as the above and as for my bed and furniture I give to my grand daughter Pollyann Allison In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal in the year of our Lord March the 9th 1819 & I appoint as my executor John Ferguson exor. & Joseph Duncanson my son in law
