I do make and ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent burial, and as touching such worldly estate as it please God to bless me with in this life I give and dispose of in the following manner I give to Jane Dickson a small Pot 1 Small Skillet 1 Large pot and Pewter dish and also I give to Nancy Combs 1 Large Kettle 1 Little pot 1 Small Skillet 1 Pint Pot Brown; and I give to Margaret Dickson one cover lid, I give to Catharine Combs one bed quilt and one Bed quilt to Emeline Combs; and one Coverlid to Nancy Jane Combs and I give to Abby Combs one little while and to Jane Dickson 2 Sheep; and to Nancy Combs one Saddle; and first Chair of my dressing to Nancy White and also I give to Nancy Combs 2 Blankets one new and the old one I give to Jane Dickson 2 Blankets one new and the other old one; and I give all my bedding and feather to Jane Dickson and Nancy Combs to be divided equally between them and also the bed clothes that is not mentioned above:

And the balance of my clothing after giving the gifts has a choice to be divided between Jane Dickson and Nancy Combs equally also my Cattle if I have any at my death they are to be divided equally between Jane Dickson and Nancy Combs. The Draper and Draper Ware and Dabb & Real plates & tubs Pot hooks Shorel and Bramble Poultry and all articles not Numerated in this will to be equally divided between Nancy Combs and Jane Dickson. # Non Capitive Will of Henry P. Barkley Deceas.

The following is a statement of a verbal will made by Henry P. Barkley who departed this life in July last (1834) - To wit - 1<sup>st</sup> he wished his funeral expenses and all his just debts paid.

2<sup>nd</sup> he gave his horse Saddle & Bridle to his Brother John St Barkley  
3<sup>rd</sup> He desired the balance of his personal property sold and the money equally divided between his mother and brother and Sisters.

4<sup>th</sup> and lastly he appointed his uncle Ebenezer Barkley his executor to carry the foregoing Will into execution.
