

Henry Storing - Will.

In the name of God Amen.

I Henry Storing of Washington County and State of Virginia being of sound and perfect mind and memory, do this tenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and one, make and publish this my last will and Testament in the manner following, that is to say, First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Margaret Storing all the property of property during her widowhood and of the land to be held, the Widow shall have the benefit during her life and at her death to be divided back to my heirs and if my Heir James Barney performs his contract, when he the said Barney comes of age concerning the parcel of land which the Testator and P. Barney has contracted for then my Executors shall pay P. Barney one half, one half by the name of Silver, one one fourth sheep and cattle that is now pasture, one cow and piggy one lot of plan iron and one and if P. Barney doth not fulfill his contract, then the P. Barney to continue as they are. Secondly, I give and bequeath unto my son Maria and Isaac Storing the above mentioned land to be divided equally between them and they are to have one share of any other property, if the land is obtained and if not an equal share with the rest of my heirs. Thirdly, my daughter, Emily, Polly and Peggy Barney and Nancy, William, William, Thomas, John & Henry Storing shall have and share equal of the movable property any of the above named heirs that is disordered to their Mother Margaret Storing my wife and do not continue to live with her until they are married, if the P. Margaret Storing shall live so long my widow, and for their disordered, they or any of them shall be cut out of their share by getting one dollar and fifty cents. But to my wife Margaret I give and bequeath her saddle and her and furniture and to do with them as she pleases. And I hereby make and ordain my beloved wife Margaret Storing and my worthy friend William Ward, Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness Whereof I the P. Henry Storing, have to this my last Will and Testament, set my hand and seal the day and year above written.

I give and bequeath and declare by the P. Henry Storing the Testator and his last Will and Testament, in the presence of us, who were present at the time of signing and sealing thereof.

Frederick Sanders Will

In the name of God Amen

I Frederick Sanders of Washington County in the State of Virginia being of sound and disposing mind and memory, having in mind the uncertainty of this life do make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner & form following, First I do give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Margaret the use of the plantation I now live on for her support if she shall choose to stay on it until my son Frederick shall come to the age of twenty one years and in that case that is when my said son shall come to be of age, my said wife and said son to have the said plantation between them unless my said wife shall have or that she shall choose to live on it but on my said wife choosing not to live on it in case of her death then in either case my son to have the whole of the land. Third I give and bequeath unto my said wife all my household furniture to be hers and one half of the horse land and one half of the cow land and the rest for sheep and half the hogs the cows and three calves to go together the ewes & lambs together the several pigs of the hogs to be divided as many as may be my said wife to have the choice of the horse land the cows & three calves the ewes & three lambs & in the separate pigs of the hogs to be hers for ever - fourth I give & bequeath to my said son my one half of the other half of all my stock and all my wearing apparel - fifth My wife & I desire to have what doctors drugs that may be on hand at the time of my death may be paid for what they may judge for to discharge the expenses of the execution of this my last will & Testament out of the balance of the balance due to me then to discharge the above expenses the son - sixth to the my said wife and lastly I do nominate & appoint my beloved friend Jacob Lemmon of Washington County in the State of Virginia to be the executor of this my last will and Testament and witness whereof I the said Frederick Sanders do hereby ratify this my last will & Testament writing & signing all other will or wills heretofore by me made this tenth day of June one thousand eight hundred and one signed sealed and acknowledged in the presence of
