

Henry Stovary - Will.

In the name of God Amen

I Henry Stovary of Washington County and State of Virginia being of sound and perfect mind and memory, do this tenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and one, make and publish this my last will and Testament in the manner following, that is to say, First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Margaret Stovary all the property of property during her widowhood and of the land he held, the Widow shall have the benefit during her life and at her death to be divided back to my heirs and if my Heir James Barney performs his contract when he the said Barney comes of age concerning the parcel of land which the Testator and P. Barney has contracted for then my Executors shall pay P. Barney one half, one holding by the name of Silver, one cow four sheep, one colt, that is now foalish, one sow and piggy, one set of plow, one cow and one axe if P. Barney doth not fulfill his contract, then the P. Barney to continue as they are. Secondly, I give and bequeath unto my son David and Isaac Stovary the above mentioned land to be equally divided between them and they are to have one share of any other property, if the land is obtained and if not an equal share with the rest of my heirs. Thirdly, my daughter Jenny, Polly and Peggy Barney and Nancy, William, Weston, Thomas, John & Henry Stovary shall have and share equal of the movable property any of the above named heirs that is disinterested to their Mother Margaret Stovary my wife and do not continue to live with her until they are married, if the P. Margaret Stovary shall live so long my Widow, and for their disinterested, they or any of them shall be cut out of their share by getting one dollar and fifty cents. Lett. my wife Margaret I give and bequeath her saddle and bridle and furniture and to do with them as she pleases. And I hereby make and confirm my beloved wife Margaret Stovary and my worthy friend William Ward, Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness Whereof I the P. Henry Stovary, have to this my last Will and Testament, set my hand and seal the day and year here written.

Frederick Sanders Will

In the name of God Amen

I Frederick Sanders of Washington County in the State of Virginia being of sound and disposing mind and memory, having in mind the uncertainty of this life do make & publish this my last will and Testament in manner & form following, First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Margaret the use of the plantation I now live on for her support of the best chose to stay on it until my son Frederick shall come to the age of twenty one years then in that case that is when my said son shall come to be of age my said wife and said son to have the said plantation between them as long as my said wife shall live or that she shall chose to live on it but on my said wife choosing not to live on it or on her death then in either case my said son to have the whole of the said. Third I give and bequeath unto my said wife all my bushes purchased to be hers and one half of the horse head and one half of the cow head and the rest of the sheep and half the hogs the cows and three calves to go together the ewes & lambs together the several eggs of the hogs to be divided as many as may be my said wife to have the choice of the horse head the cows & three calves the ewes & three lambs & in the several eggs of the hogs to be hers for ever - fourth I give & bequeath to my said son my coffee mill & the other half of all my tools and all my wearing apparels - fifth My wife & I desire to give what doctors during that may be on hand at the time of my death may be like for what they may judge for to discharge the expenses of the execution of this my last will & Testament out of the balance of the said estate to be given to my wife to discharge the above expenses the son - sixth to be my said wife and lastly I do nominate & appoint my beloved friend David Seminary of Washington County in the State of Virginia as the executor of this my last will and Testament and witness whereof I the said Frederick Sanders do hereby ratify this my last will & Testament crossing & annulling all other will or wills heretofore by me made.
