William Tyler Well

I William Tyler of Washington County State of Virginia being weak & body but of perfect mind & memory & willing to have that it is sufficient for all manner of order & command my body to the dust & to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my executors and as touching the valuable property wherewithal it hath pleased God to help me I give bequeath and dispose of the following manner— Item 1. I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Nancy Tyler the whole benefit & consideration arising from the land & wherein I now live and also the land I purchased from Hugh Ward for the purchase of her and my children as long as she may remain my widow and of the slaves Nancy the slave the one half of the benefits arising from the same lands during her natural life & the other to have the benefit of the whole stock of cattle sheep and horses & but should there remain become less the surplus quantity to be disposed of as an additional article of my personal estate my Captain & its furniture I also bequeath to my wife my house hold & kitchen furniture to be divided in the following manner (first) My Bureau I leave to my daughter Melinda together with the book case thereon also one bed bedstead and its furniture. I give & bequeath to my son William Tyler one desk one feather bed bedstead and its furniture. I will to my daughter Polly Tyler one feather bed bedstead & its furniture one Bureau & one dining table. I will & bequeath to my daughter Melinda Tyler one feather bed bedstead & its furniture one Bureau and Table one feather bed bedstead with its furniture and the remainder of the books and kitchen furniture of any, is to be the property of my wife I will that my son William Tyler have and enjoy the one half of all my estate as soon as he arrives to the age of twenty one years and if my son William should survive my wife my son William is to have & enjoy the whole of my land after my wife deceased & if my son William should die without issue the land to be divided among the rest or survivors of my children I will & bequeath that all my personal property Notes Bonds & Bank stocks (after my instruments are paid) shall be equally divided amongst & between my wife Nancy and my children but Melinda the child she had previous to our marriage is to have half the portion of the personal estate with my last wife Children my daughter Polly is to live with my widow and of the child surviving her she is then to live with my son William & to have his support out of my estate during her natural life I will that the boy of mine that I have raised shall be under the care of my widow & my heirs & executors to work for his master he arrives to the age of twenty one years & to have there Master his board & one hundred & ten dollars out of my personal estate at his proportion & my widow money for the support of the child, I do hereby nominate & appoint William Wilson Whipple Esq. & my wife Nancy executors of this my last will & testament & do hereby make it other wise or orally bequeath made by me making and desiring this my last will & testament In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this thirtieth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & twenty.

Ebenezer Embree Will

I Ebenezer Embree late Master of the town of Lanesborough Springfield being in a weak state of health of body & mind being to move the uncertainty of life as well as remain this my last will & testament & do desire of the property which it hath pleased you to bless me with in this world on the following manner (first) I do will & bequeath to my faithfull servant & slave black Nancy her freedom together with her children. James a yellow boy or gray man Abigail & Sophia her two black daughters and Mary her yellow daughter & John her son nearly black together with all the future progeny of the said Nancy & wife as the property of each & all of her children that they be & are & to treat as free persons in Pennsylvania for some year past & that they all be legally emancipated as soon as they can where the state of Godforsaking negroes has on them can be extinguished & quiete to an article which may be law among my posterity signed by myself & Godfrey Embree & Christian Embree Sons & executors of the late Godfrey Embree Dec'd. And I do hereby authorise my executors to raise the Money due of my property & pay it over to the persons designated in said articles as soon as they become of proper age to receipt for the same. As I do not believe said Nancy & her family (now) in any way answer the same they served me more than a sufficiency to maintain them as the children were chiefly brought up on the contrary that they have been a considerable expence to me. Therefore do not think myself in Justice any indebted to them or I should have made them an allowance accordingly having given said Nancy some what to start her to have & pay & expenses considerall in shelling her children yet notwithstanding I do bequeath the sum of forty dollars to each child she has & may have younger than Sophia to be law but in shelling them to the best advantage that conveniently offers the other three children having already had that much or more law out on them in that way which the a small sum of money might qualify them for such avocation as they may reasonably expect to fall into it being now there was expended on my education and I further would recommend & request my Brother Eliphalet to allow said Nancy to till on some part of our land & stay where she now is and have rent free in lifetime a sufficiency for her to cultivate for herself & family while in money & afterwards the liberty of using a sufficiency of land for herself in lifetime. I further bequeath an eighth part of whatever my estate may be worth when this ten thousand dollars to the promotion of the abolition of slavery in the United States to be laid out in such way as the convention of the Massachusetts Society of Friends may from time to time direct for the promotion of that glorious cause. That the residue of my estate be divided amongst my lawful heirs in manner & proportion as the laws of Massachusetts now direct. I do hereby appoint and request my only Brother & postman in his service Eliphalet Embree my sole executor of this my last will & testament and wish that the Courts require no security of him for the performance of his duty in the execution of this my will as I have the utmost confidence both in his talents & integrity & do not wish him embarrassed with giving security and moreover as the most of my property is held in company with my said Brother Eliphalet & whereas the same at this time is owing him considerable better to qualify him to discharge of any of the property of the sum of £ 1000 for the payment of any of the debts of said sum I do hereby authorise & empower him to sell at publick sale as publick as he may think best any of our movable property to effect the payment of the debts of said sum & further that if it shall appear necessary for him to sell any or all of our real property to effect the payment of the debts of said sum that he be hereby authorised to make such ought to be done as he may think fit.
